Peter Somogyi was born in Pecs, Hungary in 1933. At 11 years old, he was placed in a ghetto in Hungary with all the Jews. Two months later he was deported to Auschwitz with his mother, sister, and twin brother Thomas.

When they arrived at Auschwitz, after four days packed in cattle cars, Dr. Josef Mengele chose twins from the prisoner's selection lines for use in his research.

In 1949, Mr. Somogyi and his brother moved to Israel. In addition to Israel, he has lived in England, Canada and now resides in the US with his wife, two children and four grandchildren.
