

Liturgy Notes <u>Second Sunday of Easter</u> (or Sunday of Divine Mercy)

On this Divine Mercy Sunday we recall the words of Saint Thomas Aquinas: "Mercy consists in bringing a thing out of non-being into being." We see this transpire concretely in the life of the early Church. The believers "remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to the brotherhood, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers". They were filled with

awe; they were witnesses of wondrous signs; they lived "gladly and generously". God "in his great mercy" gave them—and us—"a new birth as his sons" through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. That is what the Apostle Thomas is looking for in the Lord's open side.

Entrance Antiphon

Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk, that in him you may grow to salvation, alleluia.

Collect (Opening Prayer)

God of everlasting mercy, who in the very recurrence of the paschal feast kindle the faith of the people you have made your own, increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed, that all may grasp and rightly understand in what font they have been washed, by whose Spirit they have been reborn, by whose Blood they have been redeemed. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Communion Antiphon

Bring your hand and feel the place of the nails, and do not be unbelieving but believing, alleluia.







The authorship of Regina Caeli is unknown but has been traced back to the 12th century and is found in one of the antiphon collections in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

According to tradition, this antiphon is sung for the Easter season until Pentecost. We ask that you join us in singing to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary before the final hymn at the conclusion of Mass.
