

PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



"I am the good shepherd, says the Lord. I know my sheep, and mine know me."

Each Fourth Sunday of Easter we get to remember that we are in the care of a Good Shepherd. Although our lives may be confusing and challenging, we are not alone. Our Lord has come into our midst to care for us, protect us, and lead us. If we are willing to listen for his voice and follow it, we will never be left without his guidance and will be brought through every danger and difficulty to true pasture.

A few notes to share with you:

- This weekend is the Annual Friars Formation Appeal. Welcome to Br. Jeremiah and Br. Pius who will be speaking to us at our Masses. Thank you in advance for your generosity in helping our Dominican Province prepare our young men to be the good shepherds the Church asks us to be.
- Next Saturday is our First Communions. Please join me in praying for our first communicants and their families as they prepare for this special day of encountering Jesus in the gift of the Eucharist.
- Last week the Vatican released a new document called "Dignitas Infinita" ("On Human Dignity"). The news reports I initially saw made it seem that the entire document was about "gender fluidity" and "sex changes." Dignitas Infinita does indeed speak out against ideologies of gender fluidity and medical attempts to alter one's sex. But the document as a whole is actually a very broad presentation of the basis for the Church's teaching on the fundamental dignity of the human person (a teaching, by the way, that we often take for granted, but which is in fact a distinctly Christian contribution to culture). After outlining this understanding of the human person, the document then catalogues current threats to human dignity, in turn: poverty, war, the travail of migrants, human trafficking, sexual abuse, violence against women, abortion, surrogacy, euthanasia, marginalization of people with disabilities, gender theory, sex changes, and digital violence. I encourage you to read it if you haven't already. You can find it here if you are reading this online, or by googling "Dignitas Infinita."
- There will be some changes to the friars' community in the next few months. In mid-summer, Fr. Leo will be moving to Louisville, KY where he will be assisting with pastoral ministry at our Dominican parish of St. Louis Bertrand. Additionally, we will be welcoming Fr. Ignatius Schweitzer, OP in late July as a new member of the community. He will be serving on the faculty of St. Joseph's seminary in Yonkers. I'm sure you will join me in being excited to welcome Fr. Ignatius but sad to say goodbye to Fr. Leo. I am so grateful for all of Fr. Leo's assistance these last several years, first as a parochial vicar, and then as an ever-willing familiar face in the parish even after taking a new position at the Montfort Academy. Next time you see Fr. Leo I hope you can take the opportunity to join me in extending to him a big thank you.

<u>Liturgy Notes— April 21, 2024</u>

To "take refuge in the Lord," the Good Shepherd, requires that we first face up to our own powerlessness, our limitations, and our need to follow someone if we want to experience true fulfillment in our life. Unlike literal sheep, we are aware of the risk that our Shepherd takes: "A good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep." Therefore, we exclaim, "See what love the Father has bestowed on us!" More than merely knowing the Shepherd's voice, we know his name "by which we are to be saved." Because we agree to be sheep, "we are God's children now."

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

The Music Ministry has started leading the Marian antiphon for the Easter season, **Regina** Caeli.

The authorship of Regina Caeli is unknown but has been traced

back to the 12th century and is found in one of the antiphon collections in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Regina Caeli is Latin for Queen of Heaven and this antiphon is a tribute to our Blessed Mother and an exclamation of joy at the Resurrection of our Lord.

The English translation is:

Queen of Heaven, rejoice, Alleluia
For He whom you did merit to bear, Alleluia
Has risen, as he said, Alleluia
Pray for us to God, Alleluia

According to tradition, this antiphon is sung for the Easter season, the fifty days from Easter until Pentecost. We invite you to join in singing as we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary before the final hymn at the conclusion of mass. The cards are in the inner cover of the hymnals, but this antiphon can also be found in the hymnal as #186.
