In this Sunday's gospel we hear a passage commonly referred to as the "road to Emmaus". Emmaus is a village on the road to Jerusalem that two of Jesus' follow-

ers were traveling on after the Resurrection. As they are walking, and discussing the events that have happened, they are joined by Jesus. He joins in their discussion and explains the events and scripture. Saint Luke says their hearts were burning when Jesus spoke.

This unexpected encounter with Jesus is a lesson for all of us that Jesus is present in our lives every day, even when we don't always recognize Him. Sometimes things in our lives don't make sense, and even if we know God is at work, and we pray to Him, we have difficulty understanding what He might be doing.

When we are ready, as the disciples were when Jesus broke bread with them, God will reveal His plan for us. We know He is always present for us in the Eucharist at mass, when the priests "break bread" for us. Attending mass, and becoming more aware of His blessings around us every day can be our present day road to Emmaus with Jesus.

Liturgy Notes-3rd Sunday of Easter

The disciples on the road to Emmaus hear the Scriptures interpreted in a way that had never occurred to them before. It causes their hearts to burn within them; it is what they have been waiting to hear all their lives. It moves them to beg the Stranger "to stay with them". Our hearts burn as we hear Peter interpret Psalm 15 with the same striking authority. It is as if the words that speak of Christ's Resurrection—"You have made known the way of life to me, you will fill me with gladness through your presence"—have totally revivified Peter's own life. The Word, the breaking of the Eucharistic Bread, the companionship of other followers are what make us realise how truly we have been ransomed from all futile thoughts and deeds.

Entrance Antiphon

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

Collect (Opening Prayer)

May your people exult for ever, O God, in renewed youthfulness of spirit, so that, rejoicing now in the restored glory of our adoption, we may look forward in confident hope to the rejoicing of the day of resurrection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

The Golden Jubilee Mass is for couples celebrating 50 years of marriage during 2023.


All those who wish to attend need to contact their parish secretary to register.
