

PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



"The church throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria was at peace. It was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers."

The early Church's life was a time of growth, challenge, conflict, and activity. And yet, as St. Luke describes, it was "at peace." It was at peace because it lived in reverential fear of the Lord and possessed the most wonderful of gifts: the consolation of the Holy Spirit. So grounded, it could not help but "grow in numbers" – and grow and grow....all the way to you and me. We are part of this same community of believers. We too live in a time of challenge; but we too can be at peace as we walk in the fear of the Lord and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

A few notes to share with you:

- Congratulations to our First Communicants receiving communion this Saturday (4/27)!
- The next talk in our Spring Talk Series is this Thursday (5/2) by Dr. Kevin Ahern: "Dorothy Day and the Quest for Holiness." Kevin, along with his family, is a longtime member of our parish. I hope you can join us for what will be an engaging topic.
- Join us for First Friday Mass this Friday (5/3). This is always a blessed time of grace, peace, and joy as we gather in the presence of the Risen Lord. A few months ago, we began offering the Precious Blood at the First Friday evening Mass (6pm). So many of you have told me what a joy it is to receive the Precious Blood at this Mass each month. Starting this Friday, we are going to start offering two chalices instead of one to ensure that there is enough!
- Our Parish Block Party is next Sunday (5/5) truly a highlight of the parish year. Immediately following the 11am Mass, our First Communicants will lead us in procession out the front church doors to the Mary statue outside the parish office where two of them will crown her as our Queen. Then, join us for plenty of food, music, and fellowship. You are welcome to join starting with the 11am Mass, or simply come over after the party starts around noon. I look forward to seeing you there!

Only one thing can account for such astounding well-being and prosperity: the presence of the risen Christ. "The way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us." Jesus warns, "Without me you can do nothing." Yet we live always with the confidence that comes from knowing "God is greater than our hearts." That greatness showed itself by transforming Saul into a disciple and apostle who "spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord."
