Liturgy Notes Palm Sunday Of The Passion Of The Lord

"In the palm procession our heart feels a joy mixed with sadness at sight of the Master's seemingly ephemeral triumph, prelude of suffering and death" (Archbishop Luis Martínez). Today's Mass recognises that Jesus' real triumph, glory, and kingship will be revealed when he is lifted up on the cross. Jesus' experience of being loved and hated, of being welcomed and then rejected, provides us strength to endure the caprices and injustices of our own life

Entrance Antiphon



The liturgies of Holy week are filled with some of the richest and most ancient symbols of the Catholic faith. The waving of palms today reminds us that we are called to be followers of Jesus. not iust distant fans.

The Washing of the Feet on **Holy Thursday** speaks to us of the selfless love that we are called to practice in imitation of Jesus. On this holy day we also remember the gift of the Eucharist that Jesus gave us.

The Veneration of the cross on **Good Friday** reminds us that, as Christians, we believe that Jesus can overcome anything, even death.

The lighting of the Easter fire, and the procession of the paschal candle into a darkened church from which our individual candles are lit. speaks to us of the new life that is ours because of Jesus' triumph over the darkness of sin and death through His resurrection.




Thank you to the students and their parents who have come forward to re-vive our altar server ministry. We will begin on Sunday, April 16 at the 9am and 11am Masses.
