Relígious Education



On, April 29th we celebrate the feast day of Saint Catherine of Si-

ena. She was born in Italy in

1347 and was the 25th child in her family. During the time of her birth there was an outbreak of the plague in Italy and many children, including several of her siblings died in infancy.

Catherine was a bright child and very devoted to praying. Her parents attempted to have her marry, but they were unsuccessful. She once explained that she viewed her father as a representation of Jesus and her mother as Our Lady, and her brothers as apostles, and this helped her to serve them with humility. This practice at home, was the beginning of her life's mission to help and serve the poor and the sick.

Despite Catherine's religious nature, she did not choose to enter a convent, but instead joined the Third Order of Saint Dominic, which allowed her to associate with a religious society while living at home.

Saint Catherine did not stay home, and her work attracted many followers. She called for reform in the Church and is credited with helping to start a crusade in the Holy Land for people to love God totally. She was also instrumental in restoring the Papacy to Rome and fostering peace among the Christian communities of her time.

From 1375 until her death, she wrote letters and prayers, and these works were so influential she has been declared a Doctor of the Church. In 1377 she established a monastery for women outside of Siena. Her extreme fasting led to the illness that eventually caused her death in 1380.

Saint Catherine of Siena is featured on one of the beautiful stained glass windows in our church. She remains one of the most influential and popular saints of the Catholic Church.



Liturgy Notes-4th Sunday of Easter

Peter stands up with the Eleven and preaches about Jesus, our Lord and Christ". When the people hear that it is by Christ's wounds that they have been healed, they themselves are "cut to the heart". hey beg, "What must we do, brothers?" They have found in the witness of the Apostles an authority they are eager to follow. This is what Jesus means when he says that the Good Shepherd walks ahead of his sheep and that the sheep follow him "because they know his voice". Good Shepherd Sunday celebrates the correspondence between the longing of the human heart and "the promise that was made" by God: that he would send a Shepherd so we "may have life and have it to the full".


Entrance Antiphon

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.



This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter and Good Shepherd Sunday. We have chosen music for our liturgies that reflect the theme of Jesus as a shepherd who knows his sheep by name, and is willing to lay down his life

for them.

The King of Love My Shepherd Is, our Entrance hymn, was written in 1868 by Henry Williams Baker based on the Welsh version of Psalm 23. He was ordained a priest in the Church of England in 1844 and his passion was to create new and innovative hymns for his church. The hymnal he comprised was the first one to feature the lyrics and tune for each hymn on the same page, so singers could see the pairings. It is said that Baker's last words were the lyrics from this hymn.

The setting of the Responsorial Psalm, <u>Psalm 23</u>, is written by Sarah Hart, one of the leading female composers in contemporary Catholic music. Her songs of faith, spirit and joy have touched the lives of thousands. Sarah Hart is originally from Lancaster, Ohio, and received a degree in Music Theory and Composition from Ohio State University. In addition to writing and recording, she also leads Parish missions and retreats. She now lives in Nashville with her husband and two daughters.
