

“Who indeed is the victor over the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?”

We are victors over every obstacle when we believe, acknowledge, and profess that Jesus is the Son of God. Knowing Jesus' identity is not just knowledge of a true fact, but saving knowledge: a truth that sets us free from illusions about the world and about ourselves and opens up a whole new trajectory for our life.

It was a joy to be with so many of you during Holy Week. Thank you to our decorators, musicians, liturgical volunteers, my fellow friars, and everyone who assisted in making our liturgical celebrations so beautiful. We depend upon so much generosity to make these liturgies happen and I am so grateful for all that each of you give. It really does make it possible for all of us as a parish to walk with Jesus along the road of his Passion and into the light of his Resurrection.

A few upcoming schedule notes:

- This Monday (Apr. 8th) we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation. Join us for Mass to draw close to this mystery that each Christian is called to live out as their deepest vocation.
- A week from Thursday, on April 18th, we have the first of a spring talk series that we have called “Life, Death, and the Common Good: Conversations on Catholicism and Culture.” I am so grateful for each of our speakers for their participation in what is going to be a fruitful and engaging set of evenings.
- A month from now we will have our Parish Block Party – Sunday May 5th, following the 11am Mass. Please mark your calendars so that you can join us!
- Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Take a moment to look upon our image of Jesus' divine mercy, which is the painting in our church just to the left of the organ – and to renew within yourself the words written at the bottom of that image: “Jesus, I trust in you.” The one who lives this prayer, repeating it in every chapter of life in their deepest heart – they are truly the victors of the world!

Liturgy Notes— April 7, 2024

On this Divine Mercy Sunday we recall the words of Saint Augustine: “mercy is heartfelt sympathy for another’s distress, impelling us to succor him if we can.” We see this transpire concretely in the life of the early Church. The community of believers “was of one heart and mind” and “they had everything in common.” They were filled with awe; they were witnesses of wondrous signs; they dedicated themselves to the good of the other; they were selfless and generous. They lived with the faith that “conquers the world.” That is what the Apostle Thomas is looking for in the Lord’s open side.


All Students Welcome In Grades 9-12




These days he is recognized as a leading authority on intercultural liturgical issues and music. He is a frequent lecturer, presenter and workshop leader throughout the country and specializes in offering highly practical applications and strategies.

Ricky's music can be found in Catholic and Protestant hymnals alike, and is one of our favorite composers! We use several of his hymns including **In These Days of Lenten Journey, With One Voice**, and the **Mass of Spirit and Grace**. His compositions have been used in papal masses celebrated by Pope Saint John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Francis. Fr. Manalo's music incorporates themes of social justice, care for creation, and mercy.

As a missionary priest, Fr. Manalo has been to 6 of the 7 continents to do a variety of presentations, pastoral workshops and concerts. When he is not traveling throughout the world, he resides at St. Paul the Apostle Church in New York City.
