PAROCHIAL VICAR'S GREETING—Fr. Philip Nolan, O.P.

Greetings,

A few thoughts and updates for you all:

- It's normal to flinch when we hear our Lord tell the Canaanite woman, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." But Jesus could see this woman's heart, and he knew that his rebuke would draw forth her faith, not drive her away. Saint John Chrysostom preaches, "he knew what she would say, and he would not let her great excellence remain hidden." She believed that even the smallest crumb of the food Jesus provides could bring life to her daughter. May her excellent faith be an inspiration for us!
- Often when we priests bring communion to the homebound, sick, and dying, we give them only a small fraction of a host—that's all they're able to receive. But even a crumb of the Eucharist is Jesus: body, blood, soul, and divinity. If you know someone in the parish who is homebound who would like to receive communion, please contact the parish office.
- Also, if you are already an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, please consider whether God might be calling you to help with the ministry of bringing communion to the homebound of our parish. We're in need of some assistance.
- Do you know anyone who might want to become Catholic? Toward the end of September, we'll be starting up our RCIA program—the weekly meetings that prepare people to become Catholic at the Easter Vigil. If you know someone who might be interested in becoming Catholic or any Catholic adults who have yet to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, have them visit <u>https://hiparish.org/RCIA/</u> and contact the parish office.
- I'm away for a couple weeks: first, on a pilgrimage with some other Dominicans to the Holy Land, then visiting my family. I'll be praying for the parish at all the holy places I visit in Israel. Please keep me in your prayers too!
- One final thought about being "dog-like": Saint John Vianney, whose feast we celebrated on August 4, said, "When tempted to despair, I have only one resource: to throw myself at the foot of the Tabernacle like a little dog at the foot of his master." Not a bad image to keep in mind with the Gospel we have this Sunday!

Liturgy Notes-Sunday August 20

Pope Francis wrote that "in the hour of trial faith brings light." The terrible trial of a demonically tortured child could have broken the Canaanite woman's spirit, weighing her down with despondency and defeat. But faith lifts her out of despair and carries her to the feet of Christ—the "holy mountain" she seeks. The promise proclaimed by Saint Paul—that God desires to have mercy on all—moves the woman beyond the burden of fatalism and doubt. Even Christ's silence does not dissuade her. Instead, it makes her appeal even more determined: humility, honesty and perseverance always provoke a response from the heart of God


Turn your eyes, O God, our shield; and look on the face of your anointed one; one day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere.

With the Lord there is mercy; in him is plentiful redemption.





This weekend our Offertory hymn is Softly and Tenderly Jesus is Calling. This hymn was written by Will Lamartine Thompson in 1880 and based on Mark 10:49. Thompson was born in East Liverpool, Ohio and attended the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston.

After attending a meeting of the leading evangelist of the day, Dwight L. Moody, he was inspired to devote himself to writing and promoting Christian music. He was rejected by the commercial publishers of the day, so he started his own publishing company. Softly and Tenderly soon became the opening song to Moody's evangelistic meetings and rallies. It was also incorporated into church hymnals of the day

Even though he became quite rich, Thompson continued to live a life of service. He supported various civic and religious activities generously. He was also aware of the fact that small town people had very little exposure to good music, so he loaded a piano on a horse-drawn wagon and went through small Ohio towns giving concerts of his music. He and his wife Elizabeth built a house in East Liverpool that still stands and is known locally as the Softly and Tenderly house.

When Moody lay on his deathbed in Massachusetts, Will Thompson made a special visit to see him. Moody took his hand and said, 'Will, I would have rather written Softly and Tenderly Jesus is Calling, than anything I have been able to do in my whole life."


