When I was on my Holy Land pilgrimage last summer, I visited Mt. Tabor, the Galilee mountain traditionally linked to this event. It is a spot that is both spectacular in its view and imbued with a deep peace. We are far from this Mount of the Transfiguration here in New York, but we can nonetheless always journey there just by looking upon the face of Christ in our mind's eye and by listening to his voice in quiet prayer. Let's never let a day pass without our taking a bit of time on that mountain!
- Last week we said goodbye to Br. Benedict Hernandez, who was with us for the summer. Thank you, Br.
 Benedict, for leading our parish study series on the Eucharist and for your presence at our liturgies. We
 will be praying for you as you prepare for Final Vows and Diaconate Ordination this Spring in Washington
 DC.
- The work on our roof project continues to go full steam ahead. As I am writing this, the initial layers of the new roof have been applied and the outer layers will be laid down this coming week. Thank you to all of you who have generously given towards this project. This Tuesday, August 8th we celebrate the feast of Saint Dominic, the founder of the Order of Preachers, also known as "The Dominicans".

Saint Dominic was born in Spain and spent many years dedicated to his university studies before accompanying a local bishop on a royal errand that took him across

Europe, including Southern France. It was in France that he first encountered heretics or those people who adopt and maintain practices opposed to the accepted standards of the church. He spent the better part of his short life implementing plans to bring heretics back to the faith and the church.

From 1215 until his death, Saint Dominic traveled, organized, recruited, and planned. He believed priests should be authentic and modeled a way of life filled with poverty, chastity, obedience, humility, and charity. He was known to often say "Whoever governs the passions is master of the world. We must either rule them, or be ruled by them. It is better to be the hammer than the anvil." He shared the fruits of his contemplation in every conversation and encouraged his brothers to do the same.

We wish a happy feast day to our Dominican priests who serve Holy Innocents – Fr. Luke, Fr. Philip, Fr. Leo, Fr. Frank and Fr. Mike. The Dominican order exploded with growth during Saint Dominic's lifetime, and is still today one of the Church's preeminent, and truly global, orders dedicated to scholarship, preaching, education, publishing, and evangelization. If causes are known by their effects, Saint Dominic was a relentless, one man army for God.

Have you ever noticed that some of the older hymns we use often have the same melody but different lyrics? There are several examples and this week's Entrance hymn, **Be Thou My Vision** is one of them. It uses the melody of an Irish folksong collected in the village of

Slane. Last week's **Lord of All Hopefulness** utilized that same Irish melody.

The tune for <u>I Heard the Voice of Jesus</u> is listed as Kingsfold and according to some scholars dates back to the Middle Ages. Its melodic partner, <u>Led by the Spirit</u>, is also listed with the same credits.

Speculation abounds on how this came to be. Lyricists may have used a familiar tune so that participants could focus on the words. Simple melodies fostered participation, copyright laws and litigation were not as prevalent.

In the 1800s accompanists had a "tune book" and congregants had a "hymn book". The tune played matched the lyrics based on meter and the number of syllables. As people became more musically literate, it became more common to print the melody, and provide a hymn name, often the first line, and lyrics.

Liturgy Notes-Sunday August 6 Transfiguration Of The Lord

The feast of the Transfiguration is a celebration of God's revelation. The glory of God that was veiled in the law and prophets—from Moses to Elijah—is now unveiled before the Church, to the apostles and us who receive their message. This feast does not simply point to a God who is brilliant upon a mountain. It also prepares us to remain faithful to a God crucified on a mountain. We ourselves have been saved through this vision of Christ in glory and Christ on the cross, and are now continually transformed by both Tabor and Calvary. "All of us, gazing on the Lord's glory with unveiled faces, are being transformed from glory to glory into his very image by the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Cor 3:18).

Entrance Antiphon

The Father's voice was heard: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to him.

O God, who in the glorious Transfiguration of your Only Begotten Son confirmed the mysteries of faith by the witness of the Fathers and wonderfully prefigured our full adoption to sonship, grant, we pray, to your servants, that, listening to the voice of your beloved Son, we may merit to become co-heirs with him. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.


