

PASTOR LETTER

Welcome to the Season of Advent.

Daylight is scarce. Flowers and leaves are gone. The air is cold. But although we cannot see growth and life around us, we know that it is there, and we can see its signs if we are attentive. Each of us is called to let this season be a time of attentiveness, of listening to the voice of God that speaks in the most interior space of the heart no matter the darkness or coldness of the world. If that interior listening sounds like a challenging task, ask the Blessed Mother to help you. For this is Mary's Season. Give these weeks to her in an intentional way, asking her to make your heart a "listening heart" that can hear the Word of God in every season amidst the noise of the world.

Do you have any favorite Advent books? A couple of mine: *The Reed of God* by Caryl Houselander and *Poustinia* by Catherine de Hueck Doherty.... And if I may (shamelessly?) promote a book my sister just copublished, *Soul Garden* is a collection of writings by Catholic women focusing on the experience of motherhood. Being neither a mother nor a woman, I can attest to how powerfully it speaks to any reader desiring to take note of the little seeds of grace that can fill a faith-filled heart and home. Which is to say, it too is a good Advent book.

Thanks to Irene Florio for coordinating the Advent Tea for the women of the parish this Thursday. It is always a blessed evening and a joy to see it come together each year. Thank you also to the Sisters of Life for joining us once again for this event – they are always a powerful witness to the truth and joy of the Gospel of Life.

This weekend we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent! Advent means "arrival" or "coming." It is a season of expectation and hope. Believers across the world spend the weeks before Christmas preparing for that day of beauty and light.

The first recorded mention of Advent occurred at a meeting of church leaders in Spain in the 300's A.D. The Council of Saragossa encouraged people to attend church daily between December 17-29.

The Advent wreath will be placed on the altar and each week we will light a different candle. The first candle is purple and is called the Prophet's Candle and symbolizes Hope. The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.
