

PASTOR LETTER

This weekend, we celebrate two feasts that are central to our parish. First, we celebrate the patrons of our parish on Saturday (12/28), the Holy Innocents: the babies that were killed in Bethlehem shortly after the birth of Christ. Killed by Herod to protect his throne from the "new king," their death points to Christ's true kingship. Secondly, on Sunday (12/29), we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. In the midst of the tragedy of the innocent martyrs in Bethlehem, Joseph, Mary, and Jesus make their way as exiles and refugees to the land of Egypt, to live there quietly until it is safe to return to Israel. The angel of the Lord is with them to lead them on this sojourn and to eventually bring them back to Nazareth, where they will raise Jesus. Together, these mysteries point to the work of the Lord in our midst, who leads us through every experience of pain, darkness, and tragedy. For the soul that lives by faith, hope, and love, there is always a way forward that leads to the True Homeland for which our hearts thirst.

On this occasion of our parish feast day, I once more give thanks for the beautiful triptych in the back of our church that encapsulates all of these mysteries in its three-fold scenes of journeying through the darkness of suffering by the light of faith. I also give thanks for the gift of our life together here in the Parish of the Holy Innocents. May our patrons pray for us this day, that we be renewed in faith, hope, and love as we continue our pilgrimage.

Finally, it was a joy to be with you for our Christmas Masses this past week. Thank you to all of you who worked so hard to make it a beautiful and joy-filled celebration




