PASTOR LETTER

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths!"

As we continue our journey through Advent, let's be reminded that the best way we can make straight the paths of God into our life is through prayer and the sacraments. When a human heart is reconciled to God in Confession, joined to God in the Eucharist, and illuminated by God through a regular practice of prayer, the Lord's way is truly open. Then one is ready to be led by God as his instrument in the world.

A few notes to share with you:

- Looking forward to Advent Lessons + Carols this Sunday (12/8 @ 7:30pm). Thank you to Joe, Roxanne, and our Music Ministry for this time of song and prayer to help us prepare for Christmas.
- Thank you to Fr. Mike for leading us through the Gospel of Luke in his Monday evening Advent reflections (each Monday of Advent @ 5:30pm). How much less color our celebration of Advent and Christmas would have each year without the narratives given to us in St. Luke's Gospel.
- The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (which celebrates the beginning of Mary's life in her mother's womb) is on Monday (12/9). On this day we recall that Mary was "immaculate" from the start of her life i.e., without the wound and guilt of original sin. (And yes, this is a Day of Obligation!)
- I invite you to join us for our Holy Hours each Tuesday this Advent (7-8pm). Sitting before the Eucharist listening for the Lord's voice, the Lord's path is indeed quite level and straight.
- Finally, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is on Thursday (12/12). This is an important feast day for Americans, as we celebrate the appearance of the Blessed Mother in Mexico in 1531, an event which changed our two continents forever. At Holy Innocents, we will be hanging a new image of Our Lady of Guadalupe in the church this week, in anticipation of this feast day. I am so grateful to two of our parishioners who made this installation possible through their generosity.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION


Today, Sunday December 8th, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The feast celebrates that the Blessed Virgin Mary was born free from sin from the moment of her conception in the womb of her mother, Saint Anne.

Our Blessed Mother was chosen to bear God's son, and is an essential part of the Christmas celebration and our salvation. Her motherhood provides a pathway to Heaven for all the faithful, she intercedes on our behalf, drawing us closer to her son, Jesus, and to God, through prayer

This feast often confuses Catholics who think that the Immaculate Conception refers to Jesus, but that event is celebrated on the Feast of the Annunciation, celebrated on March 25th, nine months before Christmas.

The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception dates back to Pope Pius IX in 1854 and December 8 is a Holy Day of Obligation for Catholics. When a Solemnity falls on a Sunday, as it does this year, the feast is moved to Monday and celebrated with the same joy and reverence. Please refer to the bulletin for the mass times for this great feast honoring our Blessed Mother.

The Religious Education Program is dedicated this year to our Blessed Mother, "to Jesus through Mary."





December 8, 2024 Season of Advent

Dear friends in the Lord:

As we approach the annual collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious – an appeal that benefits nearly 25,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests - I reflect on the ministry of women and men religious - past and present - and I am grateful for the ways they have shaped my own faith. I also value the tremendous service they have offered our archdiocese.

In their younger years, they laid the foundation for Catholic schools, parish religious education programs, hospitals, and works of mercy with very little compensation, leaving their religious communities with a shortage of retirement savings. Today, many serve in volunteer ministry. Others are frail and need assistance. Yet all remain committed to their vocations, accepting the limitations of aging and embracing the opportunity to spend more time praying for our Church and world.

Your gift, which will be collected on December 15, offers support that helps religious communities provide loving care for older members while ensuring younger ones can continue the good works of their elders. Rising health care costs and decreased income compound the challenge to meet day-to-day needs for medications, nursing assistance, and other necessities. Over 20 congregations in the archdiocese received more than \$2,000,000 in grants from this national collection.

While I write to you today and express my thanks for last year's contribution of \$415,957, I am also grateful to you for your support of the Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal which, in addition to other worthy causes, helps our retired archdiocesan priests at the St. John Vianney Clergy Residence in Riverdale.
