PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



Greetings,

This Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Each year, we are invited to enter into Lent via three avenues: fasting, almsgiving, and prayer. Here are a few thoughts on each.

1. Fasting:

- Is there anything that I am attached to in my life that compromises my union with God?
- Is God calling me to give up some tangible thing that I rely upon too heavily?
- Is there some voluntary practice that I can take on to remind my body that my soul is in charge of my life, and not the other way around?
- Giving up a meal to experience voluntary hunger is a time-honored practice.
- Of course, every Lent we are all of us obligated to fast from meat on Fridays and to have no more than one full meal and two little meals on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

2. Almsgiving:

- The importance of giving away some of our financial resources to the needy or to charity is one of the
 most oft-repeated practical reminders in the Scriptures. By giving away some of what we have, we
 are living the call to charity and teaching ourselves to have the open hands that are a necessity for
 heaven.
- Giving of one's time can also be a form of almsgiving. The gift of time to others is one of the most precious gifts we can give, if we enter into that time intentionally and kindly.
- Is there a charitable organization that I want to volunteer my time for?
- Is there a charitable endeavor that you would like to coordinate here at Holy Innocents? (Come and tell me about it if so!)

3. Prayer:

- If I don't set aside intentional time for prayer every day, this is the time to start. If I do set aside an intentional time for prayer each day, maybe I can add a little more time?
- Praying before the Blessed Sacrament is one of the best ways to come to know the Lord. We have
 these prayer times at Holy Innocents every Tuesday evening and every First Friday afternoon. The
 church is also open 6:30am 6pm every day and the Eucharist is always there, even if He is hidden
 in the tabernacle.
- Do I make Scripture part of my prayer? Meditating on little bits of the Gospels each day is also one of the best ways to get to know Jesus. Or perhaps this Lent is a good occasion to try out our weekly bible study (9am on Saturdays)?
- Is God calling me to attend Mass more often than on Sundays? Is there a way I could work daily Mass into my schedule?
- Praying the "Liturgy of the Hours" can be a helpful practice. If you don't want to buy the actual books, you can also find the prayers at divineoffice.org.





Liturgy Notes— February 11, 2024

"Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him." This was probably the first time the leper had ever been touched. That contact was just as compelling as his cure. The leper perceives in Jesus a compassion, a "pity." Sickness and suffering can be a powerful occasion to experience the tenderness and goodness of another. Most likely the leper never would have begged Jesus as he did if he had not been afflicted in the first place. "I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble." The leper presents himself to the Great High Priest, who "fills him with the joy of salvation." Our sufferings, like the leper's ailment, can be precisely what draw us close to Jesus.

Entrance Antiphon


Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.

Rules for Fasting and Abstinence During Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14 and ends on the evening of Holy Thursday, March 28. During the season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of fast and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fasting and abstinence**. All Fridays in Lent are days of **abstinence**.

Fasting means only one full meal a day may be taken. Two smaller meals may be eaten to maintain physical strength but together they should not equal another full meal in quantity. Snacking between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry.

Catholics ages 18-59 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. (Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.)

Catholics who have reached the age of 14 and older are obligated to abstain on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. (Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are urged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.)










ZOOM WITH THE DOMINICAN LAITY
