## PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



*"I tell you, brothers and sisters, the time is running out. From now on, let those having wives act as not having them, those weeping as not weeping, those rejoicing as not rejoicing, those buying as not owning, those using the world as not using it fully. For the world in its present form is passing away."* (1 Cor 7:29-31)

Perhaps we could rephrase this to say: let those who are married remember that their marriage is a temporary sign of the eternal marriage of the Church and the Lamb; if we are sad, let's not forget that there will be an end to our pain; let's never make the joys of this life more important to us than the joys of heaven; let's not cling to any possession as if it is something lasting; we may be in the world, but we are not of the world – and this world is passing away....

A few notes to share with you:

- This past Friday was the March for Life in Washington D.C. and this coming Monday, Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup> is a "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn." We continue to work and pray for the recognition of the sanctity of every human life, and to remember that when any person's most basic human right to life is not protected, our whole society loses. On this day of prayer, let's pray for all who have been lost to abortion, for all who suffer from having had abortions, and for all mothers and families. Let's continue to make our parish and the Church a place where parents and families know that have a home and a place of support.
- One of our ministries as priests is ensuring that each of you has the gift of the Sacraments not only when you are well enough to come to church but also when you are not able to come to church because of health reasons. Please let us know if you are be unable to attend Mass so that we can arrange for you to be brought communion, to go to confession, or to receive the anointing of the sick. Christ wants to be present to you through the Sacraments and we want to bring Him to you!

Now that we have returned to Ordinary Time, we have made some musical changes for our liturgies.

The Gloria is **Glory to God** from the **Mass of the Resurrection** by Randall DeBruyn. It is #848 in our hymnal.

Randall DeBruyn is an accomplished composer, arranger and pianist with more than 50 years of experience. He studied music at Clark College in Illinois and graduated with his doctorate in Musical Arts. Some of his most beloved compositions are **In Perfect Charity**, **the Lord is My Light** and **How Lovely is Your Dwell-ing Place**. In all of his writing his goal has been to inspire the worship of God through music.

The mass setting is from the **Mass of Renewal** written by Curtis Stephan, it begins with the Holy at #879 in our hymnal.

Curtis Stephan is a young songwriter who received his Bachelor's degree and Masters degree in Jazz studies from the University of North Texas. His compositions include **Pastures of the Lord**, **Let Us Sing to the Lord**, **He has covered himself in Glory** and **Take Up Our Cross**. Curtis is a Parish Music Director, composer and recording artist who has dedicated his life to serving the Gospel through music.

Both of these men are using their talents in praise of God. The Music Ministry is proud to utilize their compositions to do the same.

Relígious Education



The end of the Christmas season means putting away our decorations, and presents and returning to a more regular schedule of activities. In the church, the end of the Christmas season returns us to the longest season of the liturgical year, Ordinary Time.

Ordinary comes from the Latin word *ordinalis* which refers to a series of numbers. The church uses the term "Ordinary Time" to reflect the way the Sundays are numbered.

During Ordinary Time we celebrate the whole life of Jesus and learn the meaning of living as His disciples. It is an *extra*-ordinary time to learn and follow His teachings and His ways in our daily lives and grow as Catholics. The priest wears green vestments because green evokes life and growth!

In no way are these Sundays insignificant or ordinary, this is a time for us to focus on our faith. We can make time as a family to research a saint and talk about the good work they did in their lifetime to further God's message. Make time to come to our 9:00 AM Family mass and hear the word of God proclaimed by our Religious Education students, and celebrate and receive the Eucharist with your fellow classmates. Find a space in your home to designate as a prayer corner or table and display the bible or prayer cards. Make time to go to Confession or attend a Tuesday Holy Hour.

Finding ways to celebrate Ordinary Time will help your family mark this liturgical season as growing closer to knowing Jesus together as a family.
