

I hope you are surviving the summer heat!

A couple practical updates for you:

- Thank you for your generosity towards our raffle fundraiser. At the time of this bulletin printing, the final numbers have not yet come in, but it is looking like our goal of raising \$15,000 for our parish will be met. Thank you! (We'll let you know the final fundraising numbers when they come in.) This multi-parish raffle is scheduled for Saturday (7/20) at 8pm.
- We are making progress on our summer improvement projects. Thank you for your help in making them possible. Here's the latest:
 - The new lighting along the perimeter of the main church has been completed. (Note the new directionals that illumine our statues, triptych, and Divine Mercy image!) Along with the new lighting installed last summer, we now have all-LED lighting in the church, which will be cost- and energy-efficient for many years to come.
 - At Our Lady of Pompeii, the new ceiling and lights in the Social Hall have been completed, the walls painted, and the new windows along the east side of the building installed. It was a joy to have 1st Sunday of the month Coffee and Donuts last week in the bright new hall!
 - The new lighting for the Social Hall at Holy Innocents is in process. We will keep you posted.

On another note, this week is the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis (July 17-21). How beautiful for Catholics around the country to be drawing together to celebrate this Sacrament. And is this not what the Lord is always inviting us into through his gift of the Eucharist? – to become one with him and thereby become one with each other? 



Liturgy Notes—Sunday, July 14, 2024

As God once did with Amos, Jesus today removes the Twelve from their worldly occupations and sends them forth two by two. They go as poor men, without provisions, to proclaim to the world that their only real possession is Jesus Christ—and that he is enough. God chose them in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and without blemish. And we are "destined" to share in that "favor of his will." The repentance that they preach is a grace that comes to us through the Church, which abides in union with Christ by her apostolic succession. In the Church, we "hear the word of truth, the gospel of our salvation."

Entrance Antiphon

As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

O God, who show the light of your truth to those who go astray, so that they may return to the right path, give all who for the faith they profess are accounted Christians the grace to reject whatever is contrary to the name of Christ and to strive after all that does it honor.
