

Happy July 4th weekend!

This Independence Day, I give thanks for the gift of our shared life together – in our parish, in our village, in our country. Let's pray that our country be a land of true freedom, where Catholics and people of all faiths may practice their religion freely and without coercion. And may US Catholics be renewed in grace so as to be leaven of freedom and truth in our society.

On another note, every July 4th the Church celebrates the feast day of the lay Dominican Catholic, Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. If you haven't heard of him before, I invite you to look into his <u>story</u>. For starters, here's a little blurb from our US Bishops site:

Pier Giorgio was engaged in the life of the Church through regular worship and adoration, service to the poor and marginalized, advocacy for social justice for the disenfranchised and for religious liberty, regular participation in student activities, devotion to his family, and joyful companionship with his friends and fellow Catholics in his community. He saw many parallels between Catholic life and his favorite pastime, mountain-climbing. He would regularly organize trips into the mountains with his close friends with occasions for prayer, liturgies, and conversations about faith on the way up to or down from the summit.

After what would become his final climb he wrote a simple note on a photograph: "Verso L'Alto", which means "to the heights." This phrase has since come to encapsulate his philosophy of mountaineering and his Catholic outlook on life and adventure.

May we always walk with Bl. Pier Giorgio to the heights!

This weekend our Recessional hymn is This is My Song in honor of the upcoming Independence Day holiday. inistry This hymn is written to the tune FINLAN-**DIA** which was written by Jean Sibelius as a patriotic offering for a pageant celebrating the Finnish fight against Russian oppres-

sion. As with many hymns, a tune or melody enters the archives and is used time and time again by different composers for particular church traditions.

The lyrics were written by Lloyd Stone who was born in California and attended the University of Southern California as a music major, he intended to become a teacher but instead joined a circus bound for Hawaii where he remained for the rest of his life writing songs and poems. This is My Song is his best-known work and was written during the brief time between World War I and World War II describing his hope for all nations and for peace. He balances his love of country with how others feel about their homelands.

At the request of the executive secretary of the Methodist Church, Georgia Harkness wrote the third verse in 1937. The secretary wanted something with a more distinctly religious theme to supplement the love of country. Georgia Harkness was a graduate of Cornell, and studied at Yale and Harvard, she was the first female theologist to teach in a seminary.







