
Greetings,

A few notes to share with you

- Our roof project has begun! The first step has been to address the leakage that has seeped into the brick/cinderblock wall that runs along the Tompkins Ave. side of the Social Hall. There is water damage to both the interior and exterior surface of the wall.
- Thank you to those of you who immediately stepped forward to offer new donations to help pay for this big project. As I mentioned earlier, we are using all that remains in our Maintenance and Renew/Rebuild funds for this work and will also need to raise an additional 90k. I'm so grateful for your past and continued support!
- Some of you have asked me about bringing back the distribution of the Precious Blood at our Masses. There is no imminent plan to bring this back to our Sunday Masses, but moving forward it will be offered at our monthly 6pm First Friday Mass. So if you have felt a desire to receive both species of the Eucharist at our Masses, join us for our First Friday 6pm Masses (next one coming up August 4th).
- Always remember that if you are homebound and unable to attend Mass on a regular basis, you are welcome to be added to our home-communions list. Just call the office.
- This Sunday I am departing for a family visit. I will return August 5th. For any of you who are also traveling during these summer months – may your time be blessed and may you have safe travels. 

Each year on July 26th we celebrate the feast of Saints Anne and Joachim, the parents of our Blessed Mother and grandparents of Jesus. There are no mentions of them in the bible, so what we know of them comes from Catholic legend and un-

While there is room for scholarly debate about these saints, we can agree that Mary had parents. Mary's strong character, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, and her devotion to her relatives are all indications of a close-knit and loving family. Joachim and Anne were good, faithful parents who raised their daughter Mary with a love and devotion to God like none other except Jesus Christ Himself.

This feast reminds us to be grateful for our parents and grandparents! Each generation has a responsibility to make the traditions live for the next, and younger generations are reminded that older people have a great perspective and depth of experience of life's joys and trials.

Joachim and Anne serve as role models for parents, and both deserve to be honored and emulated for their devotion to God and Our Lady Mary, the Mother of God. They looked forward to the next generation even while retaining the best of the past.

Happy feast day to all parents and grandparents and all those named Ann, Anna, Anne, and Joachim!



This weekend our Entrance hymn is Tusic Praise to the Lord, written by Joachim Neander considered by many to be the inistry first important German hymnist after the Reformation. He wrote many hymns and composed the tunes for

others, but this hymn is the one for which he is best remembered and the one that appears in most major hymnals.

Joachim Neander was the grandson of a musician and son of a teacher. His family name in German was Neumann ("new man"), but as was popular at the time, his grandfather, also named Joachim, changed it to the Greek equivalent. He was born in 1650 in Bremen Germany and studied theology in his hometown from 1666 to 1670. In 1671 he became a private tutor in Heidelberg and in 1674 became a teacher at a Latin school in Düsseldorf. While living there, he would often go to the nearby valley of the Düssel river where nature served as an inspiration for his poems and hymns. Joachim also held gatherings and services in the valley and gave many sermons becoming a popular preacher among the people. The valley was renamed in his honor in the early 19th century and became famous when the remains of the Homo neanderthalensis (Neanderthal Man) were found there in 1856. In 1679, he returned to Bremen and worked as a pastor. The next year, at the age of 30, he became seriously ill and died, presumably of the plague or tuberculosis.

Coincidentally, we will celebrate his saint name, Joachim this week on Wednesday, July 26th together with Saint Anne.

Liturgy Notes-Sunday July 23

Christ's parables that we hear today make this conjoined point: God in his providence will use even the apparent evil that attends us in life to some perfecting purpose. Out of our littleness, our emptiness, our nothingness, God's greatness will flower in an astonishing way. The parables verify that our God is the God "who cares for every thing": every situation, every circumstance, every moment. God shows his might precisely when his "sovereign power is guestioned". It is easy to despair of our weakness and thus give way to it. Yet if we pray with real faith, "your power is there". "The Spirit comes to help us in our weakness.


