PAROCHIAL VICAR'S GREETING—Fr. Philip Nolan, O.P.



Greetings,

When I learned in March that I was being assigned to Holy Innocents, I had a sense of déjà vu, since I had spent the summer of 2021 here. But the big difference from 2021 (besides the fact that I'm now a priest) is that in August I won't be returning to Washington, D.C.-I'm staying put here in Pleasantville!

I firmly believe that God works patterns into our lives. Sometimes these patterns are obvious—like being assigned to the same place again, for example. Other times these patterns are less obvious and take time to see. Our relationships, our joys, our struggles, the way we pray—there are patterns in all of these.

At a dark moment in the prophet Isaiah's life, he complained to God: "You have folded up my life, like a weaver who severs me from the last thread" (Isa 38:12). In anguish, Isaiah compares his life to a tapestry, but I think we can see this image in a positive light as well. A tapestry has a lot of patterns in it. Usually, we're too close to the tapestry of our lives to see the full pattern. We see the frayed ends, the somber tones, the places where one bright color just seems to run out. We see this or that thread, not the whole multicolored pattern that God is weaving.

I'm grateful that, subjectively, this assignment seems to me to be a "bright thread." But in the end (and thankfully), it's not my view of things that matters, but his, and he knows what he's about, whether the patterns are clear to me or not.

There's a well-known poem that uses Isaiah's image to great effect. I return often to this poem, so I offer these words to you, and I hope they console you as much as they console me.

> *My life is but a weaving* Between my God and me. I cannot choose the colors He weaveth steadily.

Oft' times He weaveth sorrow; And I in foolish pride Forget He sees the upper And I the underside.

Not 'til the loom is silent And the shuttles cease to fly Will God unroll the canvas And reveal the reason why.

The dark threads are as needful In the weaver's skillful hand As the threads of gold and silver *In the pattern He has planned*

He knows, He loves, He cares; Nothing this truth can dim. He gives the very best to those Who leave the choice to Him.



The psalm verses listed in the hymnal are designed to be sung by a cantor or read by a lector. The idea of one voice inistry singing or speaking gives the congregation the opportunity to focus on the meaning and power of the words as

they flow in long, lyrical lines. Your cantors are preparing for each weekend by reading and understanding the verses so that when they sing them, they do so with clarity, allowing their meaning to emanate through them as a prayer for all of us.

The accompaniment is subtle and played softly, and usually includes only chant tones. These tones do not draw attention to themselves but provide musical support to the verses and reflect the importance of the repeated response that we all participate in.

Proclaiming the psalm verse is a vital role in our participation at this point of the Liturgy of the Word, whether the meditative and simple version in our hymnal, or one of the beautiful hymns written by a liturgical composer. Your joining in the response affirms our prayer as a community. We thank you for participating each weekend and adding your voice to the sung response.

Liturgy Notes-Sunday July 30

God says to Solomon, "Ask what you would like me to give you." "It pleased the Lord that Solomon should have asked" for an understanding heart, rather than long life or riches. For with such a request, God can work miracles. "Turning everything to their good, God co-operates with all those who love him." Solomon's heart is like that of the man who sells all he owns in order to buy the field where treasure is buried. The desire of Solomon is like that of the merchant who risks his whole livelihood in order to acquire a very fine pearl. Such sacrifices can be made only because of the certainty that this treasure, this

pearl of great price, corresponds to the deepest longing of a "discerning" heart: the longing for Christ himself.


