



For the summer we have changed the mass setting to the <u>Mass of Christ the Savior</u> written by Dan Schutte. This setting is in our Breaking Bread hymnal and we have used it many times.

Dan Schutte is one of the best known composers of church music and his works include <u>City of God</u>, <u>Here I Am Lord</u> and <u>Sing a New Song</u>. Dan holds two Master's degrees, one in Theology, and one in Liturgy. He also did graduate studies in Music composition at Seattle University. He has been awarded four honorary Doctoral degrees for his contribution to the life of the church. Most weekends he can be found on the road working at parish missions, retreats, or workshops or any opportunity to help people connect with the God who loves them and calls them by name.

Dan Schutte's music reflects his knowledge of and deep love for Sacred scripture. He wrote this mass setting with the intention to reach people's hearts and draw them into prayer. He also wanted to create a setting that parishes could use with many instruments, single piano or guitar, or simply acapella. We look forward to your participation in singing it with us this summer!




