

PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



Blessed Solemnity of Corpus Christi!

Today we are called to remember that Jesus is not just our travel companion or our role model or our teacher: he is our food and drink. We depend on him living inside of us just as much as we depend on the sustenance of physical food to get through the day.

I want to take this opportunity to remind all of us that if we want to experience the strength that Jesus' presence brings, we must receive him in the mode that he gives himself to us – which is the Real Presence of the Eucharist. By making the Eucharist the center of our lives, we discover Jesus' Real Presence to us.

Come and spend time with Jesus in the Eucharist when we offer Adoration here at Holy Innocents, every Tuesday 7-8pm and every first Friday of the month from 1-6pm. Come by the church any day to pray quietly near the tabernacle. If you don't come to Mass every Sunday, begin doing so. If you come to Mass weekly, consider coming to Mass during the week as well. Go to confession every month so that the graces of the Eucharist you receive at Mass can have room to grow in your soul.

Jesus is alive and he is living with us! On this feast of his Body and Blood, let us all enter more deeply into communion with him.

Liturgy Notes-Sunday June 11

Saint John Paul II reminded us that the Church "does not only celebrate the Eucharist but solemnly bears it in procession, publicly proclaiming that the sacrifice of Christ is for the salvation of the whole world." We rejoice in this post-Easter expression of our Eucharistic faith and devotion in order to deepen our attachment to the unique and unending Event that transforms our lives: "Out of the darkness of my life, so much frustrated, I put before you the one great thing to love on earth: the Blessed Sacrament.... There you will find romance, glory, honour, fidelity, and the true way of all your loves on earth" (J.R.R. Tolkien). As the Sequence for Corpus Christi begs: "Oh, feed us still, still keep us thine;/ So may we see thy glories shine/ In fields of immortality".

Entrance Antiphon

He fed them with the finest wheat and satisfied them with honey from the rock.

Collect (Opening Prayer)

O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Communion Antiphon

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, says the Lord.



This Sunday we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, presently known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy inistry Body and Blood of Christ. Our Recessional hymn will be I Heard the Voice of Jesus. This

hymn was written by Horatius Bonar who was born in 1808 in Edinburgh, Scotland, the son of a ruling elder in the Church of Scotland. After a relatively uneventful upbringing, Bonar entered into the ministry himself, becoming pastor of the North Parish in the rural town of Kelso.

What makes the hymn so widely appealing may well be its focus on the gospel call of Christ to come to him, look to him, drink, and rest. On this feast where we focus on the Eucharist, the hymn reminds us that we can find in Him all that He has promised.

For the 11:00 AM mass this weekend, we will omit the recessional hymn as we begin the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. We will sing the traditional O Salutaris Hostia which was written by St. Thomas Acquinas specifically for the feast of Corpus Christi.

Join us in singing the Marian Antiphons at our sung Masses each Sunday. This season's antiphon is "Salve Regina ." Music cards are available in the pews.




