## Religious Education

On Saturday, June 22 we celebrate the feast day of Saint Thomas More, a man who stood up to authority in defense of his Catholic beliefs and lost his life for doing so.

Thomas More was born in London on February 7, 1478. He enrolled at Oxford University in 1492, where he learned Latin and Greek and prepared for his future studies. In 1494, he left Oxford to become a lawyer and almost as soon as he did, he found himself contemplating another path. For two years, More lived next to a Carthusian monastery, following their lifestyle of simple piety and often joining in their spiritual exercises. By 1504, More had decided to remain in the secular world, but he did not forget inspiring example of those monks.

Thomas More began a post with King Henry VIII and, because of his skill and work ethic, the king gave him increasing responsibility. He was one of Henry VIII's most effective and loyal servants. However, in 1530, Henry wanted an illegitimate annulment from his wife, Catherine. More refused to sign a letter to the Pope in support of the king's wishes. This was More's first time crossing Henry.

By 1532, More found himself unable to work for Henry VIII and resigned. More then refused to attend the coronation of Anne Boylen, Henry's new queen. Henry viewed More's absence as a refusal to acknowledge his claim to be head of the church and state, and he called for More's arrest and imprisonment. More was sentenced to death. In his final statement, he proclaimed himself to be "the king's good servant, but God's first." Thomas More was a man of tremendous piety, integrity, and penitence. He was canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935, and he is the patron saint of adopted children, lawyers, civil servants, politicians, and difficult marriages.

Saint Thomas More followed his conscience and stood up for what he knew was right. Something that is never easy.
