PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



"I am the living bread that came down from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Blessed Corpus Christi Sunday! Today we remember that the Incarnation did not happen only once for all, two thousand years ago in Galilee. Rather, it has continued to happen sacramentally every time disciples of Christ gather to commemorate the Last Supper. In the Eucharist, God continues to incarnate himself in our world, taking on the appearance of bread and wine so that we can taste and see him. What St. John marvels at in his First Letter is the lived experience of every Catholic in every age: *"What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we looked upon and touched with our hands concerns the Word of life – for the life was made visible; we have seen it and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was made visible to us!" (1 John 1:1-2).*

On this day I invite you to be renewed in your devotion to the Eucharist. Make the Mass the center of your life; incorporate Confession into your monthly schedule so that your reception of Communion may be fruitful; make time to pray in the presence of the Eucharist at Adoration or anytime the church is open.

A few notes to share with you:

- A continued welcome to Br. Titus and Br. Pius. I hope you have a chance to welcome them this weekend. Among other things, they will be helping with a parish study series meeting weekly this summer. The topic will be Prayer. I hope you can join us. (...who doesn't desire to enter more deeply into prayer?)
- This Friday is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart as well as a First Friday. As always, join us for Mass, Confession, and Adoration. Allow Christ to renew and refresh you. (By the way, a note regarding the 6pm Mass that day: this has not been finalized at the time of this bulletin publishing, but it is likely that Fr. Charles Rooney, who was with us as a student brother two years ago and ordained a priest last weekend, will be with us as the celebrant of that Mass!)
- I will be away the next two weekends on a family trip. You will be in my prayers, please keep me in yours. Thank you to my fellow friars for their extra help during this time....

I count on your usual generosity again and thank you for your donation of \$285,622 in 2023 which was divided equally between the two concerns. LED lighting in the perimeter of the main church

We installed new LED lighting in the hanging fixtures of the main church last year. Relighting the droppedceiling perimeter area will complete the job.

The new fixtures will be smaller, more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable (a needed feature for events like our Wine Tasting), look better, and last longer.

Our Lady of Pompeii windows and social hall







Religious Education

Today we celebrate one of the most glorious feasts of our Catholic faith, Corpus Christi or the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is arguably the richest feast due to what we celebrate, the Eucharist, the "source and summit of the Christian life" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1324).

St. Juliana of Liège, a town in Belgium, was a nun who had a deep devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Through prayer and visions she felt that Jesus gave her a mission to make the church recognize a special feast for the Body and Blood of Christ. Sr. Juliana was a nun in the Middle Ages without any power or influence. She shared her visions with her confessor.

In 1263, Father Peter of Prague was celebrating Mass and blood began seeping from the consecrated host. Father Peter brought this miracle to the bishop, who was also aware of St. Juliana's visions. That same bishop soon became Pope Urban IV.

Pope Urban proclaimed the feast of Corpus Christi to the whole church and commissioned a Dominican friar, St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the feast's liturgical text and hymns. Some of the hymns sung at Benediction (Tantum Ergo and O Salutaris Hostia) are the result of Thomas' efforts.

Catholics celebrate Corpus Christi on the Second Sunday after Pentecost. Many dioceses and individual parishes host Eucharistic processions that go blocks or even miles chanting and praying. This is in answer to the call to express love of the Eucharist to the world, and "proclaim on the housetops" (Matthew 10:27) what the apostles came to know at the Last Supper.
