This weekend our Recessional hymn is <u>America the Beautiful</u> in honor of the upcoming Independence Day holiday. This American patriotic song was written by Katharine Lee Bates, a professor at Wellesley College in Massachusetts.

In 1925, Katharine described her inspiration for writing the poem that developed into one of the nation's best-loved patriotic songs. She had traveled west to teach a sum-

mer course in Colorado Springs and she and her fellow professors decided to "celebrate the close of the session with an expedition to the top of Pike's Peak." They made the ascent by prairie wagon and mules.

Once at the top, she was struck by the "sea-like" expanse of the fertile country, under ample skies. Although she was tired, when they reached the top, she felt great joy and it seemed to her that all the wonder of America was on display. The opening lines "floated into my mind".

Katharine finished the poem before leaving Colorado Springs, but did not publish it for two years! Her words were set to music written by composer, Samuel A. Ward, a church organist in Newark, New Jersey. Ward and Bates never met, and he died in 1903, a year before his music and Katharine's lyrics were joined.

In 1904, Katharine gave up all royalties, and granted permission for the free use of the hymn to appear in church hymnals and Sunday school song books of nearly all denominations, as well as regularly published song books, poetry readers, manuals of hymns and prayers, and anthologies of patriotic prose and poetry. Although she was initially surprised at her poem's success, she later reflected that it endures because "Americans are at heart idealists, with a fundamental faith in human brotherhood." Katharine Lee Bates died in 1929 and is buried in Falmouth, Massachusetts. She was inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1970.


