The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you.

On this Trinity Sunday, we thank our God for revealing the mystery of his inner life to us, so that we may know Him not only as our Lord, but as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. 


The recessional hymn for this weekend's celebration of the Most Holy Trinity is the traditional hymn of praise, **Holy God We Praise Thy Name**. It was written in German in 1771 by Ignaz Franz, and is a paraphrase of the Latin Christian hymn, **Te Deum**.

Ignaz Franz was born in Poland and studied Philosophy and Theology before being ordained a Roman Catholic Priest in 1742. He wrote hymn lyrics and compiled religious music in addition to his position as the Assessor for Theological Affairs at the Apostolic Vicariate in Poland.

The original German, *Grosser Gott, wir loben dich*, was translated to English by Clarence Augustus Walworth in 1858. Translators are hymn writers too and contribute greatly to the library of hymns used in Christian worship. These writers have the challenge of translating the words, while honoring the content with language that fits the metrical rhythm of a pre-existing tune. Clarence Walworth considered a vocation as an Episcopal priest, but followed his father's desire for him to become an attorney. He passed the bar, but soon abandoned law, moved to New York and became a Roman Catholic priest. He is one of the founding members of the Order of Paulists.

We thank these two Catholic priests for the memorable melody and theme of one of the most popular hymns in dioceses around the world.

Dear friends in the Lord:

Parishes across the country are preparing to collect an offering for the *Church in Latin America* and *The Catholic Home Missions Appeal* on June 11. Here in the archdiocese, these two collections have been combined into one. I ask for your support with these vital requests.

In Latin America, because of generous people like you, many pastoral projects are reinforced both there and in the Caribbean. For the past fifty years, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops [USCCB] has helped 25 countries in Central and South America, and the Caribbean confront challenges to the faith and raise people from poverty.

Your aid to the *Catholic Home Missions* will assist in making a difference in the lives of our brothers and sister right here in the United States by strengthening the Church in our own backyard. Four out of ten dioceses in the United States and its territories are considered "home mission" dioceses with small Catholic populations, limited financial resources, vast and often difficult terrain, and a shortage of priests and religious. Despite the challenges, the communities continue to grow in faith to serve God and neighbor and form the next generation of faithful disciples.

I count on your usual generosity again, and thank you for your donation of \$250,910 in 2022 which was divided equally between the two concerns. Liturgy Notes-Sunday June 4

The Catechism teaches that "by sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange" (221). By worshipping the Trinity we realise the full truth of ourselves. "The three persons are one truth" (Saint Augustine). This truth is the saving truth of God's own life, which we begin to live on earth by the gift of faith. "The complete Trinity dwells in us" (Father Marie Michel Philipon, o.p. (God reveals the fullness of his very self to us that we "may not be lost but may have eternal life", and that we might be received as his own. I
