#### PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



"We are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance."

You and I are God's "handiwork" – his "artwork" or "craft." There was no necessity that we should exist; but God chose to create us. The meaning of our existence, therefore, lies in us acknowledging that createdness, living in humble and grateful acknowledgment of that creation. My life is to be lived not as a radical freedom, but as a response, as something reciprocal. We can do this by living each day "on the lookout" for the "good works that God has prepared" for me. To live each day asking, *What work have you prepared for me today*? – is to become the artwork I was created to be.

A few notes:

Philip and I were able to be at most of the championship games and we were so impressed with all of our teams. Truly a beautiful sight to see so much teamwork, discipline, and energy on display. #### Rules for Fasting and Abstinence During Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14 and ends on the evening of Holy Thursday, March 28. During the season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of fast and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fasting and abstinence**. All Fridays in Lent are days of **abstinence**.

**Fasting** means only one full meal a day may be taken. Two smaller meals may be eaten to maintain physical strength but together they should not equal another full meal in quantity. Snacking between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry.

Catholics ages 18-59 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. (Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.)

Catholics who have reached the age of 14 and older are obligated to abstain on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. (Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are urged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.)



Each year during Holy Week, we have the privilege to gather with our archbishop to celebrate the Mass of the Chrism which will take place on Tuesday, March 26, 2024 at 4:00 PM at St. Patrick's Cathedral.

At this liturgy, His Eminence will bless the Holy Oils used in the celebration of the sacraments throughout the archdiocese and the priests will renew their commitment to clerical service.

The Cardinal has hopes to fill the cathedral with parishioners, eighth graders, confirmation classes and high school students. This is such a powerful gesture of love and support, as well as a sign of

personal affirmation for priests.

The Religious Education program is very proud of our students who have been participating as gift bearers and lectors at our 9:00 AM Family masses. We are also grateful to all who volunteer for these roles in the various masses we host for the Religious Education community.

There are more opportunities for the students to participate in their parish liturgies and we hope you will consider them.

**Altar Serving**: open to all boys and girls from the 3rd grade up. This is an important role in assisting our priests in the celebration of mass. Servers may carry the cross, the processional candles, hold the book for the celebrant when he is not at the altar, carry the incense and censer, present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people. Please speak with Fr. Philip Nolan if you are interested.

**Music Ministry**: good preaching and good music are essential to liturgy. We are blessed at Holy Innocents to have both. Consider using your musical gifts to participate in the music at mass. Junior Choir sings for the 9:00 AM mass on Sundays, and welcomes those in First through Fifth Grades. The Music Ministry would like to begin a Teen Choir to sing for the Saturday 5:15 pm Vigil mass and welcomes those in Sixth Grade through High school to join. Please speak with Joe DeSanctis if you are interested.

Serving the parish, especially during our liturgies, is a wonderful way for our children to actively participate in their faith, as they are learning the principles and beliefs that are part of our Catholic tradition.



Each week the Music Ministry works to create a music program that echoes and emphasizes the themes of the liturgy. This weekend the themes are very Lenten! They are mercy, redemption, water and rebirth.

Our entrance hymns speak of hope, through God's mercy; we can always be reconciled and our lives start again. The offertory hymns we have chosen marvel at God's love for us and at communion we will sing of longing to be in His presence, and free from sin. We conclude our liturgies with <u>The Church's One Foundation</u>, which is a

beautiful hymn that reminds us that during this more solemn, penitential season, God is always with us.

Music is a powerful tool. We use it each week to bring these themes to our minds through interesting and lovely melodies and arrangements. It is our intent that you join us in singing, and are inspired to hum, or sing them even beyond the time in church and live the themes they remind us of.
