

PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.

Christ is risen, Alleluia! He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Today we not only remember a past event, but enter into it. The resurrection of Jesus on that historic day two millennia ago continues to extend its power and light all the way to you and me today. Our Risen Lord is with us today, he is speaking to us today.

What is he saving?

In an ancient homily, an early Christian preacher imagines what words Jesus, following his victory on the cross, might have spoken to Adam who, with Eve, ate the apple and lost Eden for us all. They are words for each of us today, as Jesus pierces the darkness of our sin, fear, and death:

Awake, sleeper, I have not made you to be held a prisoner in the underworld. Arise from the dead: I am the life of the dead. Arise, O man, work of my hands, arise, you who were fashioned in my image. Rise, let us go hence; for you in me and I in you, together we are one undivided person.

For you, I your God became your son; for you, I the Master took on your form; that of slave; for you, I who am above the heavens came on earth and under the earth; for you, man, I became as a man without help, free among the dead; for you, who left a garden, I was...crucified in a garden....

See the scourging of my back, which I accepted in order to disperse the load of your sins which was laid upon your back. See my hands nailed to the tree for a good purpose, for you, who stretched out your hand to the tree for an evil one.

I slept on the cross and a sword pierced my side, for you, who slept in paradise and brought forth Eve from your side. My side healed the pain of your side; my sleep will release you from your sleep in Hades: my sword has checked the sword which was turned against you.

But arise, let us go hence. The enemy brought you out of the land of paradise; I will reinstate you, no longer in paradise, but on the throne of heaven. I denied you the tree of life, which was a figure, but now I myself am united to you, I who am life. I posted the cherubim to guard you as they would slaves; now I make the cherubim worship you as they would God.

The cherubim throne has been prepared, the bearers are ready and waiting, the bridal chamber is in order, the food is provided, the everlasting houses and rooms are in readiness; the treasures of good things have been opened; the kingdom of heaven has been prepared before the ages.



Liturgy Notes — March 31, 2024

God is faithful. What he promised of old, he has brought to fulfillment: "Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed," and he has truly risen, just as he said. "We are witnesses" of these things, Peter proclaims, and so too are we. We revel in the same grace, communicated by the same Christ through the same Church. Easter confirms that salvation is real and present to us now—today and forever. Love now reigns definitively. Death and sin are overcome. Christ's Resurrection is our resurrection, for he has opened for us the gates of eternal life. It is on this truth that we stake our whole lives. Filled with the glory of Christ's Easter triumph, we cannot help but cry out: Alleluia!

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Communion Antiphon

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed, alleluia; therefore let us keep the feast with the unleavened bread/ of purity and truth, alleluia, alleluia.






