Lazarus, come out!


Jesus' voice pierces the air, reaching all the way to the back of the cave where Lazarus' body has lain for days.

And Lazarus comes out. Although he is tied hand and foot with burial bands, he cannot help but obey the voice of his Creator. He is untied and given a new life.

You and I have not yet experienced the darkness of biological death, but all of us do know the darkness of that cave and the wrappings of those burial bands: isolation, selfishness, depression, pride, doubt, or anxiety can bring us there.

These words are therefore for us too. Jesus' voice pierces the air of our tombs, reaching all the way to the back of the cave of every self: *Come out!*

And at the mere sound of His voice, we become alive. For to hear and receive the voice of Jesus is to live.



Liturgy Notes—5th Sunday Of Lent

From time immemorial God has promised, "You will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people." But this will not happen before Jesus weeps. He weeps in front of doubt: "Are you going back again?" He weeps in front of nihilism: "Could he not have prevented this man's death?" He weeps in front of fatalism: "Lord, by now he will smell." This is the optimum moment for God to have Lazarus rise from his grave, for then the event will teach us just how far we must go in trusting the power of Jesus' love for us. Although "dead... because of sin...the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead...will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you"


