PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

This Pentecost Sunday is the birthday of the Church: that great day when, anointed with the Holy Spirit, the apostles came forth from the upper room to announce the mystery of salvation to the world. On this day we not only recall that great nativity, but allow it to be made new in us. We are part of that same Church of Peter, the Blessed Mother, and the first friends of Jesus. For we have received the same Gift of the Spirit Who has taken us up into the same work of salvation. Pope St. John Paul II writes,

"In the midst of the problems, disappointments and hopes, desertions and returns of these times of ours, the Church remains faithful to the mystery of her birth. While it is an historical fact that the Church came forth from the Upper Room on the day of Pentecost, in a certain sense one can say that she has never left it. Spiritually the event of Pentecost does not belong only to the past: the Church is always in the Upper Room that she bears in her heart. The Church perseveres in prayer, like the Apostles together with Mary, the Mother of Christ, and with those who in Jerusalem were the first seed of the Christian community...."

Today, let's be renewed in gratitude for our life in Christ and in His Church – which we have through the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

<u>Liturgy Notes— Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024</u>

When the Holy Spirit was poured forth at Pentecost, Christ's Paschal Mystery was brought to completion, and the Church was fully equipped to carry on his redemptive work in the world. At Pentecost, it is revealed that we remain always intimately united to our heavenly Father, who will shepherd his people home to the glory of heaven. "On that day, the Holy Trinity is fully revealed. Since that day, the Kingdom announced by Christ has been open to those who believe in him: in the humility of the flesh and in faith, they already share in the communion of the Holy Trinity. By his coming, which never ceases, the Holy Spirit causes the world to enter into the 'last days,' the time of the Church, the Kingdom already inherited though not yet consummated"

Summer '24 Improvement Projects

We're continuing to update and improve our facility!

LED lighting in the perimeter of the main church

We installed new LED lighting in the hanging fixtures of the main church last year. Relighting the dropped-ceiling perimeter area will complete the job.

= \$11.000

LED lighting in the Social Hall

The new fixtures will be smaller, more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable (a needed feature for events like our Wine Tasting), look better, and last longer.

= \$51,500

Our Lady of Pompeii windows and social hall

The windows in the sacristy and the bathrooms of OLP need to be replaced, and we will refurbish the OLP hall (new lighting, new ceiling, repainting) which is used regularly for Sunday refreshments, meetings, and events like the Seven Fishes Dinner.

= \$44,000







Happy Pentecost Sunday!! This feast marks the end of the Easter Season. We have chosen the traditional hymn for this day, **Come Holy Ghost**. Most of us learned

this hymn as children and can probably sing at least the first verse from memory! The hymn helps us celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles enabling them to go forth on the mission that Christ entrusted to them: to spread the Gospel to all nations. They could not do this without the Holy Spirit.

One of our favorite contemporary composers, Steve Angrisano, has written the setting of Psalm 104 which we are using this weekend. This psalm praises God's majesty as the creator of life and all creation's dependence on God for sustenance. We used this same psalm after the First Reading for the Easter Vigil which tells the story of creation, and for this past weekend's Confirmation liturgies. The psalm links these three significant occasions in our parish, and reminds us of God's Wisdom and God's life-giving breath as we pray, "Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the Earth."

Rain or shine—On Friday, May 31st the Pleasantville Volunteer Fire Department will hold it annual Fire Fighter's Parade.


The parade will begin at 7:00pm and will include more than 20
