Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; to God who is, who was, and who is to come.

Blessed Trinity Sunday! Each time we gather together and make the sign of the cross, we say, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." When we say this, we are giving that hour of time to the Blessed Trinity. Today when we make the sign of the cross, let's allow our whole lives to be lifted up to him, leaving no part outside of the fountain of communion that is our Triune God.

<u>Liturgy Notes— Sunday, May 26, 2024</u>

Far from a merely academic concern of theologians, the Church's teaching about the Triune God "is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them" (CCC 234). In contemplating and loving the blessed Trinity, we behold the truth of who God really is: a communion of Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is that mystery and that life that we are called to share in: "The Church is a creation of the triune God," wrote Archbishop J. Augustine DiNoia, "from the Father, who sends his Son and his Spirit to transform creaturely persons so that they come to share, with the uncreated Persons of the Trinity and with one another, a communion of divine life."

Summer '24 Improvement Projects

We're continuing to update and improve our facility!

Each improvement is well worth it, but comes with a price tag. See the cost outline below.

All donations marked "Maintenance" will go towards these projects until they are paid off.

Thank you in advance for your help!

LED lighting in the perimeter of the main church

We installed new LED lighting in the hanging fixtures of the main church last year. Relighting the dropped-ceiling perimeter area will complete the job.

= \$11.000

LED lighting in the Social Hall

The new fixtures will be smaller, more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable (a needed feature for events like our Wine Tasting), look better, and last longer.

= \$51,500

Our Lady of Pompeii windows and social hall

The windows in the sacristy and the bathrooms of OLP need to be replaced, and we will refurbish the OLP hall (new lighting, new ceiling, repainting) which is used regularly for Sunday refreshments, meetings, and events like the Seven Fishes Dinner.

= \$44,000

TOTAL COST = \$106,500 FUNDS RAISED = \$23,719

FUNDS STILL NEEDED = \$82,781

Suffering, Hope, and the Atom Bomb FOLLOW UP

Dr. James L. Nolan spoke eloquently of the Catholic community in Nagasaki, Japan. After the Japanese government expelled all missionaries, the faith was continued by the Hidden Christians for 7 generations until meeting a Catholic priest in 1865. The Immaculate Conception Cathedral was rebuilt after being de-

stroyed by the atomic bombing in 1945. The original church had 2 bells towers. Today the right tower holds the original bell found in the ruins and reinstalled. The left tower remains empty. There is an effort to make a new bell to fill that void. 


Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage 9*28*24 at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington,

hymnal and can also be found on the cards in the pews. We invite you to join us in singing.

Recited as a prayer in the vernacular, it is used as the final prayer of the rosary. For centuries, Dominicans have been instrumental in spreading the rosary and the Catholic belief in its power.
