

PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.

"In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him."

In our walks of faith, each of us has the privilege of discovering that these words of St. John are our own words, that they apply to us personally. Following Christ in faith, hope, and love, we learn to say, *"In this way the love of God was revealed to me: God sent his only Son to me so that I might have life through him."* And so, I would ask you: What has this revelation of his love been for you? What is this new life that you live in Him? How have you experienced this sending of God's Son to you?

A few notes to share:

- This Sunday was going to be our May Crowning and Block Party, but at the time of this bulletin printing, the weather report is looking very unfavorable. So <u>we are going to move it to May 19th</u>. Please re-mark your calendars and plan on joining us in two weeks!
- 2. We have a few maintenance projects coming up this summer:
 - New LED lighting for the dropped-ceiling perimeter of the main church area. We installed new LED lighting in the hanging fixtures of the main church last year. Redoing the perimeter area will complete the job.
 - **New LED lighting in the Social Hall**. The Social Hall lighting is very much in need of being updated. The new fixtures will be smaller, more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable (a great feature for events like our Wine Tasting), look better, and last longer.
 - Replacing windows on the east side of Our Lady of Pompeii. These are the windows in the sacristy and the bathrooms. They are very much in need of replacement to keep that side of the building secure.
 - OLP Social Hall: new LED lighting, ceiling, and repainting. It's time for a facelift for the OLP hall, which is used regularly for 1st Sunday refreshments, meetings, and events like the 7 Fishes Dinner.

Please see the cost breakdown in the bulletin for all of these projects, which are much needed but not cheap. Thank you in advance for your generous assistance in helping us with these updates. Donations can be made by listing them for "Maintenance."

3. Speaking of physical plant improvements, we received a huge amount of help in the last two months from the scouts of Hawthorne Scout Troop 1, who put in multiple workdays at Our Lady of Pompeii. They focused on the exterior of the building: scrubbing, power washing, weeding, re-caulking, resetting masonry, repainting, and decluttering the landscaping. We will have a special reception to thank them following the 10am OLP Mass on Sunday, June 2nd. But in the meantime, thank you Troop One!

Entrance Antiphon


Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

LED lighting in the perimeter of the main church

We installed new LED lighting in the hanging fixtures of the main church last year. Relighting the droppedceiling perimeter area will complete the job.

= \$11,000

LED lighting in the Social Hall

The new fixtures will be smaller, more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable (a needed feature for events like our Wine Tasting), look better, and last longer.

= \$51,500

Our Lady of Pompeii windows and social hall

The windows in the sacristy and the bathrooms of OLP need to be replaced, and we will refurbish the OLP hall (new lighting, new ceiling, repainting) which is used regularly for Sunday refreshments, meetings, and events like the Seven Fishes Dinner.



Have you ever noticed that some of the older hymns we use often have the same melody but different lyrics? There are several examples in our hymnals and this week's Recessional hymn, **The Day of Resurrection**

is one of them.

This hymn was written by St. John of Damascus and translated by John Mason Neale. St. John of Damascus lived in the seventh century, some suggest he may have lived to be 100! His excellent literary and philosophical education in Damascus contributed to his renown as the author of liturgical hymns. John Mason Neale was born in the nineteenth century to an evangelical home. He devoted much of his life to improving social conditions in his area, but his gifts of poetic expression led to his major contributions to church hymnody. He was ordained in the Church of England in 1842.

The tune for this hymn is known as <u>Ellacombe</u>, a melody of German origin not attributed to any specific composer. Its melodic partners are <u>I Sing the</u> <u>Mighty Power of God</u>, and <u>Go Make of All Disciples</u>.

One of our parish favorites, <u>The King of Love My</u> <u>Shepherd Is</u>, also has a partner, <u>O Breathe on</u> <u>Me, O Breath of God.</u> The tune for these hymns is listed as traditional Irish melody and attributed to St. Columba.

Speculation abounds on how this came to be. Lyricists may have used a familiar tune so that participants could focus on the words. Simple melodies fostered participation, copyright laws and litigation were not as prevalent.

In the 1800s accompanists had a "tune book" and congregants had a "hymn book". The tune played matched the lyrics based on meter and the number of syllables. As people became more musically literate, it became more common to print the melody, and provide a hymn name, often the first line, and lyrics.


