Liturgy Notes-5th Sunday of Easter

The Lord Jesus has called us "out of the darkness into his wonderful light". We hear him do that very concretely in the Gospel today. He reassures us with these words: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me.... I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life....

Whoever believes in me will perform the sam works as I do myself". This is the Word of God that "continued to spread" so that the number of disciples "greatly increased". And this increase is what the risen Christ contiues to offer the Church through the ministry of priests and deacons so that his faithful "may be living stones making a spiritual house".

Entrance Antiphon

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

Collect (Opening Prayer)

Almighty ever-living God, constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us, that those you were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism may, under your protective care, bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal. The setting of the Lamb of God we are currently using was written by David Clark Isele. It is one of our favorinistry ites, and showcases the composer's ability to write interesting and complex harmony for choirs.

David Clark Isele was born in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania and educated at the Oberlin Conservatory of Music in Ohio. At the age of 27 he joined the faculty at the University of Notre Dame and founded the Notre Dame Chorale.

He served at the University of Tampa as a Professor of Music, Composer in Residence and Director of Vocal Activities. At the University he founded the Collegiate Chorale, the Women's Glee Club and Musical Theater Ensemble.

David Isele wrote more than 100 works in diverse genres including instrumental pieces, large choral works, chamber pieces and anthems. He was a world renowned organist and musical scholar. He was a revered, loved and respected professor and his knowledge, passion and dedication to music impacted the lives of thousands.

He died in 2016, but his Lamb of God continues to be sung by congregations in the United States and throughout the world.


