

PASTOR LETTER

Indeed, the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart.

This is why we draw close to the Scriptures: not because we want to hide from the world, but because we want to be open to the gaze of God. The Lord gives us the option of creating a life apart from Him, but our deepest hearts will never be at peace until we allow Him to come into us and order our souls according to His wisdom. Today and every day, let's make room for His Word: praying the Psalms, reading the Gospels, asking for the gift of His Spirit.

A few notes to share with you:

- This Thursday is our Potluck Theology Night. I hope you can join us for this evening of food, beer, theology, and fellowship. I'm thrilled to welcome our speaker Fr. Gabriel Torretta OP from Providence College and I know you will enjoy meeting him.
- Thank you to Fr. Philip for leading the Rosary Pilgrimage a couple of weekends ago. I am grateful that so many of you were able to join for this graced trip.
- Have you heard about the Jubilee Year starting in Rome this December and continuing all of next year? This is a big deal, as it happens only once in a while (the last one was in 2015). Search "Jubilee 2025" to see the impressive schedule of events.
- Now and again I get asked why we pray the Prayer to St. Michael at the end of our non-music Masses. Here are a few answers: 1) early in his pontificate, Pope Francis asked the whole Church to pray this prayer more regularly; 2) it helps us remember that angels are real and that we should live in communion with them; 3) it helps us remember that demons are real and that it behooves us to ask for protection from them.
- Thank you if you joined us in praying the Rosary in the church this past Monday. On that sober anniversary of the Oct. 7th terrorist attacks in Israel, we prayed for the people of Israel, Gaza, Lebanon, and for peace throughout the world. In an age of much strife, our Blessed Mother is always there to lead us in prayer.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Have you ever noticed that some of the older hymns we use often have the same melody but different lyrics? There are several examples and this week's Entrance hymn, **Be Thou My Vision** is one of them. It uses the melody of an Irish folksong collected in the village of Slane. The hymn Lord of All Hopefulness utilized that same Irish melody.

Speculation abounds on how this came to be. Lyricists may have used a familiar tune so that participants could focus on the words. Simple melodies fostered participation, copyright laws and litigation were not as prevalent.

In the 1800s accompanists had a "tune book" and congregants had a "hymn book". The tune played matched the lyrics based on meter and the number of syllables. As people became more musically literate, it became more common to print the melody, and provide a hymn name, often the first line, and lyrics.
