

DOMINICAN ROSARY BUS TRIP

Rest areas on Interstate 95 are, at best, places of necessity—often crowded, at times smelly, always somewhat depressing. But last Saturday morning, when our bus of thirty-plus pilgrims heading to the Dominican Rosary Pilgrimage pulled into a rest stop in Maryland, we were met by a surprise. We spotted two Dominican friars standing with a group. They were from St. Vincent Ferrer, our church in NYC, and they were heading the same place as us. I thought: *Wow, God can even turn rest stops into happy places. He must want to bless this day.*

And indeed he did! It was a day touched by grace. A little before 10am, we arrived in Washington, D.C. at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception. The massive church already felt very alive. All sorts of people filled the space. Young college students sat next to old couples in the pews. Parents shepherded their kids through the cavernous building. Toddlers ran in and out of the many side chapels. Priests and nuns dotted the crowd. The church was full and alive.



Fr. James Sullivan, who preached our parish mission last Lent, gave a couple great talks. There was time for adoration, confession, exploring the basilica, and a tour (just for our group), led by Br. Titus, of the Dominicans' chapel. The pilgrimage ended with Mass and an energetic outdoor concert by the Hillbilly Thomists, a bluegrass band made entirely of Dominican priests.

For me, the most memorable experience was praying 15 decades of the Rosary with the other pilgrims. Now I realize that praying the Rosary for an hour straight probably sounds boring. But, somehow, praying in unison with thousands of others made it easy to focus and the time seem insignificant.



Every pilgrim had a favorite highlight. For some, it was simply seeing so many other Catholics. For others, it was the music provided by the Dominican schola throughout the day. Others noted the fine preaching. But all of us noted the daylong atmosphere of joy.

Even as we drove back to Pleasantville late at night, that joy remained on the bus. Mary seemed to let us in on the secret of her prayer: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my savior." That spirit of rejoicing marked the whole day, beginning with the surprise at the rest area early in the morning.

MUSIC MINISTRY

The Music Ministry was deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Janice Sanders. Janice was a loyal supporter of our efforts since her daughter Katie joined us in the Second Grade. Katie remained an active member moving from the Children's Choir into the Teen Choir.

After Katie graduated high school, Janice continued to applaud and compliment our efforts to engage the children and young people of our parish through music. She often remarked that the music heightened her experience of the beauty of the mass, and she was inspired to see young people participating and using their talents in praise of God.

Our deepest condolences to Janice's husband Tom, son William, and Katie. May our Music Ministry continue the joy she experienced in the liturgies at Holy Innocents.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

On July 1, Pope Francis and the College of Cardinals voted to approve the canonization of the first Millennial Saint, Blessed Carlo Acutis. Millennials or Generation Y, refers to those born between 1981 and 1996.

Born to Italian parents in London, England, in 1991, Blessed Carlo was a web designer who died from leukemia at the age of 15 in Monza, Italy. He was known for his devotion to Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions, which he catalogued on a website he designed.

Acutis showed interest in helping others from a young age. He frequently defended schoolmates who were bullied, and he spent money he had earned on items for people experiencing poverty, such as a sleeping bag for a man without a home

whom he encountered on the way to his church. He also sought to help elderly and disabled people in his community as well as other refugees. His devotion inspired his parents to become practicing Catholics, and his mother became especially devout.

Apart from practicing his faith, Acutis enjoyed playing video games and was fascinated with computers. He learned how to use the internet and taught himself computer programming and graphic design. As a form of penance and spiritual discipline he limited his screen time to one hour per day. Blessed Carlo's died at the age of 15 from leukemia. His feast day is celebrated on October 12th and his official canonization is scheduled for 2025.
