

PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



“On this mountain [the Lord of Hosts] will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations; he will destroy death forever. The Lord GOD will wipe away the tears from every face; the reproach of his people he will remove from the whole earth; for the LORD has spoken.”

In this passage from Isaiah in our readings this Sunday, the mountain the prophet refers to is Zion, the mount upon which the city of Jerusalem is built. Hearing these words today, I cannot help but think of the tears and death that descended upon the Holy Land last weekend. Kidnapping and intentionally killing civilians to achieve political objectives is barbaric, and these acts have brought the level of tragedy on all sides of the conflict to horrific levels.

Pope Francis has called us to come together in prayer for peace in Israel and Palestine. I invite you to come for our Holy Hour, 7pm this Tuesday (10/17) to pray for peace and to place this conflict in the hands of God, who alone can conclusively “destroy the veil that veils” us from one another and “wipe away the tears from every face.”

Month of the Holy Rosary

Dear friends in the Lord:

On October 22, *World Mission Sunday*, we stand in solidarity with the Missions of the Church in the annual worldwide Eucharistic celebration. As I write to you today, I express my gratitude for last year's archdiocesan contribution of \$337,162. Pope Francis reflects on this year's theme "Hearts on Fire, feet on the move." Here the Holy Father invites us to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts and to actively share this warmth with the world. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we go forth and bring the Good News to all the corners of the world.

Blessed Pauline Jaricot, a lay French woman founded the *Society for the Propagation of the Faith* in 1822 and is an essential aid for the Church's missionary work. In the United States, we as the Church have benefitted from these donations; up until 1908, we received close to 7 million dollars, equivalent of over 250 million today.

The collection taken up at all Masses on *World Mission Sunday* assists the Holy Father meet his Petrine obligation to build the Church in over 1,100 dioceses and territories that are too young and or too poor to sustain themselves. Offerings support the formation of seminarians, men, and women religious, assist in the construction of schools and orphanages and enables missionaries to build churches in remote and resource-limited areas, and to supply essential works to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

I encourage your generosity on *World Mission Sunday* while keeping your hearts aflame and your feet moving. Your prayers remain your greatest gift, and your financial support is life-giving to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities.





Religious Education



The month of October is traditionally celebrated as the month of the rosary. The rosary is divided into five groups of ten beads called decades. Catholics were

not the first to pray with beads. Men and women of many faiths and cultures including Hindus, Greeks, and Buddhists, have and do use beads to pray. The word bead in English is actually derived from an Old English word that means prayer. The use of prayer beads almost universally is to allow the person to keep track of the number of prayers being said.

As we pray the rosary, the repetition of the prayers assists in prayerful meditation. We reflect on the specific events in the lives of Jesus and Mary to deepen our relationship with them and understand God's love for us.

The Sorrowful mysteries are prayed on Tuesdays and Fridays and on Sundays during Lent. These are the saddest events in Mary's life, and in praying them we learn from her example that even in the darkest days of our lives, God is with us and hears our prayers. They are The Agony in the Garden, when Jesus is betrayed by Judas, bound and led away, The Scourging at the Pillar, Jesus is cruelly beaten, The Crowning of Thorns, a crown is placed on Jesus' head mocking Him, and causing pain as the thorns press into His scalp, The Carrying of the Cross, Jesus is condemned to death on a wooden cross, and the Crucifixion.

We will learn about the Glorious mysteries next week!
