Triptych of the Holy Innocents

The *Triptych of the Holy Innocents* is an original work of art by James Langley specially commissioned for the Church of the Holy Innocents in Pleasantville, NY. It was donated in honor of Vincent Leheny (1936–2020) and installed September 11th, 2023.

What is a triptych?

The triptych is a classic genre of Christian artwork. It consists of five paintings on three panels which are joined together by hinges. Three of the paintings are visible when the panels are "open"; the other two are visible when the panels are "closed." The triptych is open or closed depending upon the liturgical season.

In the *Triptych of the Holy Innocents*, the interior panels reflect upon the events recorded in the second chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, and the exterior panels depict two women of the Dominican Order.

The Interior Panels

The central interior panel depicts a mother and child. But unlike many mother-child images, this is a scene of deep tragedy: the child is lifeless, and the mother holds his body in anguish. It evokes the pain of the massacre of the Holy Innocents which is recounted in Mt. 2:16-18.

The left interior panel shows the journey of the magi traveling from the east to find the *"newborn king of the Jews"* (Mt. 2:1-2). They are journeying through the darkness of night towards Jerusalem. There they will meet Herod, who will order the massacre of the innocent children. But their eyes and hearts are fixed on the light; they are following the star.

The right interior panel depicts Mary and Joseph's flight into Egypt, as they journey to protect Jesus from Herod (Mt. 2:13-15). Like the magi, they journey through the night. They have narrowly escaped the massacre and will be foreigners in this new land. And yet, God continues to be present. An angel leads them, pointing the way. This angel will be with them in Egypt, ready to tell Joseph when it is safe to return to Galilee.

The Exterior Panels

The two exterior panels depict two great Dominicans. On the left is St. Catherine of Siena (1347-1380), the Italian mystic who was made a "Doctor of the Church" for her influential writings. As usual, she is depicted with a crucifix, a book (representing her "Dialogues"), a crown of thorns, and the wounds of the stigmata.

On the right is Rose Hawthorne (1851-1926), also known as Mother Mary Alphonsa, who devoted her life to caring for terminally ill cancer patients. She founded the Congregation of Saint Rose of Lima, whose members serve at Rosary Hill Home in neighboring Hawthorne, NY. In one hand she holds a crown of roses in honor of her namesake and patron; in the other, she fingers a rosary, a pillar of Dominican prayer.

Taken together, the five panels attest to the great truth of our Faith: although the world and our lives are marked by sin and suffering, the bright light of God's presence continues to abide with us amidst every darkness, guiding all who walk by faith, hope, and love towards our Heavenly Homeland.

Dear friends in the Lord:

Every day I receive many letters from our wonderful parishioners, but none cheers me more than when I read how much the faithful love their devoted priests. And as you know, almost all of them were educated and formed at *St. Joseph's Seminary*, Dunwoodie, now beginning its 128th year.

Our seminarians are not only the future shepherds of our flock, but they will also be spiritual guides and leaders in our wider communities.
