

PASTOR'S GREETING

"Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

Sometimes we can go through long times in our day, in our week, in our life, in which Jesus seems silent and absent. But in these words he gives us a helpful clue for how to find him. Jesus likes to hide in little people, in little places, in little things. Wherever there is unassuming littleness that does not seek to be more or less than that which the Heavenly Father has given it to be, there He is. If we desire to see Him and hear Him more clearly in our lives, there we must look for him: in the faces of people who are little in spirit, in the quiet corners of the street that the crowd passes by, and under the appearance of the silent and small bit of bread that is the Eucharist.

SUMMER IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

We're continuing to update and improve our facility. Each improvement is well worth it, but comes with a price tag. All donations marked "Maintenance" will go towards these projects until they are paid off.

- LED lighting on the perimeter of the main church = \$11,000
- LED lighting in the social hall will be more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable, and look better = \$51,500
- Our Lady of Pompeii windows and social hall are being refurbished with new lights, ceiling, and fresh paint = \$44,000
- *Total Cost = \$106,500*

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

On Saturday September 21 we celebrate the feast of Saint Matthew, one of Jesus' apostles and one of the four gospel writers. Saint Matthew was the son of Alphaeus and was most likely born in Gailiee. His name was Levi before his call by Jesus. Matthew is a shortening of the name Mattathias, which means "gift of God".

Saint Matthew was working as a tax collector which was a hated profession during the time of Jesus. According to the gospel, Jesus came to him and said, "Follow Me', and with this simple call, he became one of Jesus' disciples. Through his writing, we learn about how Jesus worked to spread a message of salvation and to bring all people to God through Him. Saint Matthew's account is the first of the four gospels in the New Testament. Since many of the people of the day were expecting a messiah brandishing a sword, he wrote his Gospel to testify to his fellow Israelites that Jesus was the Messiah and that His kingdom had been fulfilled.

It is thought that Saint Matthew escaped to Parthia and Persia or Ethiopia to escape persecution. There is no recording of how or where he died. Since Saint Matthew was a tax collector, he is the patron saint of bankers.

Dear friends in the Lord:

When my mail arrives every day, I look forward to letters from our wonderful parishioners, but none cheers me more than when I read how much the faithful love their devoted priests. And as you know, almost all of them were educated and formed at *St. Joseph's Seminary and College*, Dunwoodie, now beginning its 129th year.
