

PASTOR'S GREETING

Some of Jesus' words are comforting. Some are harsh. The Gospel for this Sunday is one of his harsh messages. It is hard to read it without wincing and feeling unsettled. But it is a reminder to us that the Christian life is not just a set of platitudes to make us feel comfortable. It is full of rude awakenings, painful uprootings, and continually renewed calls of vigilance. We must always be asking Jesus, "What do you desire to uproot in my life? What part of my heart still needs to be converted? Am I living a life completely oriented to your purifying light?" Those who ask him these questions with true desire for his grace will always be answered.

A few notes to share with you:

- Our group of pilgrims left by bus on Saturday morning (9/28) to attend the Rosary Pilgrimage in Washington, D.C. Thank you to Fr. Philip for organizing this trip and I can't wait to hear about it from those of you who went. Whether you were one of the pilgrims or not, all of us are invited to remember this weekend the great gift that the rosary is for us as Catholics. Although our lives are busy and we are easily distracted, we are always able to enter into the perpetual prayer of our Blessed Mother by praying the rosary, allowing her to draw us, bead by bead, into her life of fruitful union with the Lord.

LITURGY NOTES

As both Joshua's and Jesus' disciples learned, God uses the least likely people to be his instruments of grace, which uproots from us the self-righteousness we so easily exhibit. Moses asks Joshua, "Are you jealous for my sake?" After all, wouldn't it be good if all were moved by the Spirit of God to speak the truth? "For whoever is not against us is for us." Selfishness and pride are a corrosion that will "devour your flesh like a fire." This is why the Lord calls for such aggressive efforts to root out sin and focus on God. Jesus' startling images capture how supremely valuable health of soul is. In the end the only thing that matters is that we "belong to Christ" and "enter into life."

SUMMER IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

We're continuing to update and improve our facility. Each improvement is well worth it, but comes with a price tag. All donations marked "Maintenance" will go towards these projects until they are paid off.

- LED lighting on the perimeter of the main church = \$11,000
- LED lighting in the social hall will be more luminous, energy efficient, dimmable, and look better = \$51,500
- Our Lady of Pompeii windows and social hall are being refurbished with new lights, ceiling, and fresh paint = \$44,000
- Total Cost = \$106,500

MUSIC MINISTRY

On October 4, we will celebrate the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. Saint Francis is known as the patron saint of animals and the environment.

Our Entrance hymn, **All Creatures of Our God and King**, was written by Saint Francis. Saint Francis was a great lover of nature and saw the hand of God in all creation. Throughout his life Saint Francis appreciated the importance of church music and encouraged singing in his monastery.

In 1225, he wrote this hymn to urge others to have absolute trust in God as he demonstrated through his own life. At the age of 25, Saint Francis left an indulgent life and became determined to live meagerly and to imitate the selfless life of Christ.

The words he wrote reflect his love for all of God's creation and that all should take time to be aware and enjoy the beauty of our world, while praising God.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Today, September 29, 2024 is the Feast of the Archangels, St. Gabriel, St. Raphael and St. Michael. These are the only three angels mentioned by name in scripture. Unlike human beings who share a common nature, St. Thomas Aquinas teaches that each angel has a unique nature based on their degree of likeness to God. There are groups of angels called choirs. Those closest to God are in the highest choirs, and those closest to mankind are in the lower choirs. Seraphim, Cherubim and Thrones are among those in the higher choirs and angels and archangels in the lower choir.

Saint Michael is the chief angel in heaven. In Hebrew Michael means "who is like God?" He is usually depicted with a sword, defeating the devil. Saint Michael is the patron of soldiers, police and first responders.

Saint Gabriel is a true messenger of God and appeared to Zechariah, and our Blessed Mother with news of what was to come. In Hebrew Gabriel means "power of God". He is usually depicted with lilies to symbolize purity. Saint Gabriel is the patron of radio broadcasters, postal workers and messengers.

Saint Raphael is known as the angel of God serving people in need of healing. In Hebrew Raphael means "God heals". He is usually depicted with a fish symbolizing the means he used for healing in the bible. Saint Raphael is the patron of travelers, nurses, pharmacists and physicians.

"Saint Michael, our protector, Saint Gabriel, messenger of Good News, Saint Raphael, divine healer, hear our prayers."
