

#### PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



Jesus looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to [the man], "Ephphatha!" – that is, "Be opened!" – and immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly.

This weekend marks a new beginning of sorts in our parish. As the first weekend following Labor Day, it is the weekend in which the "fall semester" starts and many things are kicking off. Here's a few of the things starting up:

- Our religious education classes for grades 1-8 begin this week. Welcome to our students. This Sunday
  we are celebrating "Catechetical Sunday" in which we have a special recognition and blessing of our catechists at the 9am and 11am Masses. Thank you, catechists, for your witness and the gift of your time
  and talents I am personally grateful. And thank you to our DRE Roxanne and our Assistant DRE
  Roseann for their leadership.
- Our new group for high schoolers, "Follow Me," begins this week. Led by Fr. Philip and myself, it is part
  discussion group and part prayer group. Our goal for the group is very simple: through conversation and

- We are now taking registrations for a new group for 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade boys called Sons of Joseph, starting up next month. This is the boys' version of the group for 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade girls called Daughters of Mary. Thank you to Rosemarie Pomilla who designed the curriculum for these groups and to Frank Pomilla and Hans Gspandl for leading the boys group.
- Next weekend we welcome Fr. Allen Moran OP, the Provincial of our Dominican Province (in simpler language, my boss). He will be the celebrant of the 11am Mass (9/15). Please join me in offering him a warm welcome.

Stay tuned for events coming up next month like the Wine Tasting as well as a lecture series.

As we press "go" on a new parish semester, let's draw close to the Lord Jesus. He is the one who opens the way, who says "Ephphetha" for us, who clears the path for his flood of grace to come into our parish and our lives. 

#### Liturgy Notes—Sunday, September 8, 2024

To give hearing and speech back to the deaf and mute man restores his ability to enter fully into human communication: to hear the voice of a friend and to express himself with ease. But his many years of suffering led to an incomparable privilege: the first voice he hears is Christ's, the first person he speaks to is Jesus. "Here is your God," O once deaf and mute man, "he comes with divine recompense, he comes to save you." If we "adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ," we will be healed of every infirmity and be "heirs of the kindom that he promised to those who love him."

In remembrance of the tragedies of September 11, 2001, the lives that were lost, and for the loved ones they left behind who are still grieving every single day, we have chosen <u>For the Healing of the Nations</u> as our recessional hymn.

This song was written by Fred Kaan in 1968 as a song of peace. He was born in Haarlem, Netherlands and his family was active in the Dutch resistance hiding many refugees during the Nazi occupation. Three of his grandparents died of starvation due to the famine during the war. These teenage experiences of wartime had a lasting effect and he became a pacifist.

The title is derived from the words in the Book of Revelation, 22:2, "on either side of the river is the tree of life....and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations." The guiding theme is that through prayer we will be led forward in freedom, and a reminder that we are all made in the image of God, and to be more like Christ in all that we do.

The Music Ministry hopes you will take a moment today to pray for peace in our world, and use this day as a reminder of how short life is, and that we should treasure each day with affection, tenderness, love and laughter.
