
# DAUGHTERS OF MARY 5th-8th Grade Girls



# Liturgy Notes— Sunday, August 25, 2024

The scribes and the Pharisees disregard God's commandments and cling instead to their own self righteousness and sense of superiority. Since their hearts are far from God, evils like malice, deceit, blasphemy, and arrogance come "from their hearts." But God endows us with "statutes and decrees" in order to rescue us from our own fallen tendencies and to give us a way to "live, enter in, and take possession of the land." By allowing our hearts to be formed by God's commandments, we "give evidence of our wisdom and intelligence to the nations." For such obedience reveals just how close to us is the God who "wills to give us birth by the word of truth." "Humbly welcome the word that is able to save your souls."

As we celebrate the Labor Day weekend, the Music Ministry has chosen the beautiful hymn, **Come to Me** by Gregory Norbet. The hymn is based on Matthew 11:28-30 and Psalm 23.

"Come to me, all who labor and are heavy burdened, and I shall give you rest."

This song reminds us that Jesus offers us rest from the heavy and difficult things in life that each of us bears. By sharing our life's ventures with Him, our burdens are lighter. Following Jesus requires work, but with Him we can live life to the fullest and accomplish the purpose God has for us.

Gregory Norbet began his musical journey early in life, his family sang together for fun around his grandfather's piano. He remembers music for his family was an expression of happiness and togetherness, bringing light and joy into everyday life.

He became a Benedictine monk in the Weston Priory community in Weston Vermont founded in 1952. This community is part of the Catholic Diocese of Burlington and is known for the songs they have contributed to Roman Catholic worship over the past 50 years.

He founded the Hosea foundation, a non-profit ministry dedicated to fostering the experience of God's love and compassion in the world by promoting spiritual development.
