PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



"My soul rejoices in my God"

On this third Sunday of Advent, we are invited to rejoice.

A natural response might be to ask, but how is it possible to rejoice when there are so many problems in the world, in our country, in my life?

But the answer to this question is that yes, we can rejoice. We can rejoice because God is here.

Today we get to hear some of Mary's *"Magnificat"* – her song of praise that she sings shortly after she has conceived the Son of God. Each of us is in her place by virtue of our Christian lives and especially each Advent. Although Jesus often seems hidden, he is indeed alive within us, in that quietest place in our hearts; and if we are attentive to him, we can discover his presence – his infinite joy and peace. His quiet joy is the only true joy – and it will have the last word in this world.

A few notes to share with you:

- I invite you to come to Confession this Monday, Dec. 18th. We will have confessors available at Holy Innocents from 2-4pm and 6-8pm. There are also confessions at these times in every other parish in the Archdiocese. There is no better way to open our hearts to the gift of his presence than Confession.
- Next weekend, the Fourth Sunday of Advent is on the morning of the 24th, followed by the Christmas Eve Masses that evening, and the Christmas Day Masses on Monday the 25th. See the guide in the bulletin for how our Sunday Mass obligation corresponds to the Christmas Mass obligation. (And yes, as good Catholics, we like to have answers for these technical questions! :)

Liturgy Notes— December 17, 2023

"Rejoice in the Lord," for as miserable as life can seem at times, the reality is that God has clothed us "with a robe of salvation" that heals our poverty, our broken hearts, our bondage. "He has mercy on those who fear him," that is, those who look to him with awe and love. Therefore, "be preserved blameless for the coming of Jesus." Even though in the troubles of life you may not recognize him, "the one who calls you is faithful."

Entrance Antiphon

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

<u>Collect</u>

O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Communion Antiphon

Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear. Behold, our God will come, and he will save us.

a vigil Mass on the evening of Saturday, Dec. 23rd


any Mass being offered on Sunday, Dec. 24th (regardless of whether it is a Sunday morning Mass or a Christmas Eve Vigil Mass)

The bottom line: we should attend two Masses for the two obligations! :)








Pope Francis' December Intentions For the Pope For persons with disabilities

Relígious Education

This weekend we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent. The third candle on the Advent wreath will be lit and it is known as the candle of joy. Instead of the previous two weeks of purple or violet, this week the color of the candle will be different: it is pink or traditionally called rose. You may be curious about the color changing - it stems from the original name of this Sunday which is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means rejoice, and it is part of the tradition of the mass beginning with the Latin phrase "Gaudete in Domino semper iterum. dico Gaudete" meaning "Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I say rejoice". Our second reading chosen for today from Thessalonians reflects that sentiment and begins

"Rejoice Always, pray without ceasing."

The Third Sunday has traditionally been a respite from the penitential themes of Advent and emphasizes the joy of the coming of the Lord. During a time where depression can be high and people may feel loneliness or despair, this pink candle offers a bright light during a dark time. The joy that comes from God alone cannot be deterred by present circumstances. The candle is also sometimes referred to as the Shepherd Candle to highlight the joy the shepherds experienced when they received the good news about Christ's birth during the middle of the night, the darkest time, the shepherds encountered angels!

In addition to the color of the candle, our priests will also wear vestments that are rose colored to reflect the joy of this week. Look at the beauty of the Advent wreath and all the candles, but this week focus on the meaning of the pink candle and vestments and know that joy comes through Jesus' arrival and the salvation he has gifted us. This third week we experience an eager anticipation of wonderful things to come!
