#### PASTOR'S GREETING—Fr. Luke Hoyt, O.P.



When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him (Mt. 25:31-32).

On the last Sunday before Advent, we always celebrate Jesus as "King of the Universe." This rather grand title is the mirror image of the Jesus we behold on the cross, the hidden mystery that the cross both conceals and reveals. On the cross, we behold how he emptied himself of all glory for our sakes. But we also behold him as the hidden Lord of the Cosmos. For, lifted high on the cross, he reveals to us a divine love and power that has its origin beyond this world. As Christians, we can walk amidst the tumult of earthly kingdoms in confidence and boldness because we have founded our lives on Him – whose kingdom will always endure.

On another note, I invite you to join us for First Friday this week. With multiple Masses (7am, 12:15pm, 6pm), Confession (4:30-5:30pm), and Adoration (1-6pm), there is ample opportunity to meet your King in the Sacraments and allow him to renew your life.

#### Liturgy Notes- November 26, 2023

"Since the announcement of his birth, the Only-Begotten Son of the Father, born of the Virgin Mary, was described as 'king' in the Messianic sense, that is, heir to the throne of David...for a Kingdom that would have no end. The kingship of Christ remained completely hidden until he was thirty years old, years spent in an ordinary life in Nazareth. Then, during his public life, Jesus inaugurated the new Kingdom which 'does not belong to this world,' and finally, with his death and Resurrection, he fully established it. Appearing to the apostles after he had risen, he said: 'Full authority has been given to me both in heaven and on earth.' This power flows from the love that God manifested in its fullness in the sacrifice of his Son. The Kingdom of Christ is a gift offered to the people of every epoch so that those who believe in the incarnate Word 'may not die but have eternal life'" (Pope Benedict XVI).

#### Relígious Education



On Thursday, November 30<sup>th</sup>, we celebrate the feast of St. Andrew, the Apostle, older brother of St. Peter.

According to the New Testament, Andrew was born in the village of Bethsaida on the Sea of Galilee during the early first century. Much like his younger brother, Simon Peter, Andrew was also a fisherman. In the Gospel of

Matthew, it is said Jesus was walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee and saw Andrew and Simon Peter fishing and asked the two to become disciples and "fishers of men."

In the Gospel of John, Andrew is described as a disciple of John the Baptist, and when Jesus walked by, John the Baptist stated, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" and it was then that Andrew decided to follow Jesus. Per Christian tradition, Andrew went on to preach the Good News around the shores of the Black Sea and throughout what is now Greece and Turkey. Andrew was martyred by crucifixion in Patras, Greece. It is believed that St. Andrew requested to be crucified by being bound not nailed and on an X-shaped cross, called a "saltire" because he deemed himself unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus. Today this type of cross is commonly referred to as St. Andrew's Cross.

St. Andrew is the patron saint of fishermen. He is also the patron saint to several countries including Scotland, Romania, Russia, Ukraine and the city of Patras. His saltire cross is featured on the flag of Scotland and is represented in much of his iconography. He is commonly portrayed as an old man with long white hair and a beard, often holding the Gospel book or a scroll.
