



This weekend our Recessional hymn is <u>For the Healing of</u> <u>the Nations</u>, written by Fred Kaan. Fred Kaan was born in Haarlem, Netherlands in 1929

and his teenage years coincided with the Nazi occupation. His parents were active in the Dutch Resistance and three of Fred's grandparents died due to the Nazi induced famine. The experiences of wartime in the Netherlands had a lasting effect on him and in his teens he began to attend church and received his Confirmation. When he entered college, he chose to study theology and was ordained in 1955 as a minister of the Pilgrim Church in Plymouth England. It was in this congregation that he began to write hymns.

This particular hymn was written for a service for Human Rights Day. It is his most widely published hymn and reflects his commitment to addressing issues of peace and justice throughout his life. This hymn has four stanzas. The first three stanzas deal with common societal problems: poverty, war, and prejudice. The fourth stanza is a reminder that humankind is created in the image of God.

With our world in need of God's peace, we thought joining together to pray for healing in song was an appropriate ending to our liturgical celebrations this weekend.


All Students Welcome In Grades 9-12






Thanks to all who participated in our Religious Education Pumpkin Carving event last Saturday. Thirteen families participated and it was fun to see the
