Bible Verse about the Feeding of the Five Thousand

This week, we learned the Bible verse about the feeding of the five thousand. Jesus blessed the little bit of food He had, and it miraculously multiplied enough to feed all those people. We experience something very similar at every Mass, when the priest blesses the bread and distributes Holy Communion to all the people.

When Jesus raised His eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little [bit]." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves* and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now, there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted.
