



The Easter season welcomes the return of the sung Gloria, and the Alleluia as our Gospel Acclamation. The Gloria we are now using is from the <u>Mass of the Resurrection</u> by Randall DeBruyn, and the Gospel Acclamation is from the same mass setting.

Randall DeBruyn is an accomplished composer, arranger and pianist. His goal in composing is to inspire worship of God through music. He studied music at Lewis and Clark College in Portland, Oregon and graduated with a Doctorate degree in Music Arts.

He has worked for Oregon Catholic Press (OCP), the name of our hymnal company for over thirty years as editor of their missals and hymnals. He has since retired but continues to serve as a member of the music selection committee.

The Music Ministry enjoys many of Randall DeBruyn's compositions including In Perfect Charity, and How Lovely is Your Dwelling Place. He currently resides in the Portland area with his family. He is working on a new collection of liturgical music as well as his Emmanuel Symphony.

Liturgy Notes for Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday April 11, 2021

On this Divine Mercy Sunday we recall the words of Saint Thomas Aquinas: "Mercy consists in bringing a thing out of non-being into being." We see this transpire concretely in the life of the early Church. The community of believers "was of one heart and mind" and "they had everything in common." They were filled with awe; they were witnesses of wondrous signs; they dedicated themselves to the good of the other; they were selfless and generous. They lived with the faith that "conquers the world" That is what the Apostle Thomas is looking for in the Lord's open side. "The secret of Christ's heart is revealed to us through the clefts of his body" (Saint Bernard). (us.magnificat.net)
