This week in Mrs. Graj's Sixth grade class, they marked Lent with Butterflies. This activity is one of Mrs. Graj's yearly classroom events with her class. She beautifully modified it for our Corona-virus days, through her ZOOM session.

This weekend our Communion hymn is **<u>Transfigure Us</u>**, **<u>O</u> Lord**</u> written by composer Bob Hurd. We have chosen this hymn since it relates so beautifully to this week's gospel about the transfiguration.

In <u>Transfigure Us, O Lord</u>, Bob describes our devotion to God as a journey, taking us to the top of a high mountain. Our spiritual transfiguration moves us from meek believers to servants graced with thanksgiving, not withholding anything but acknowledging our gifts and freely giving them away. Our faith empowers us to embrace the journey of life with an awareness of who is by our side and proclaim in peace and love the word of God.

Bob Hurd completed his Ph. D. at DePaul University in Chicago, Illinois in 1980. Bob's articles have appeared in <u>Worship</u>, <u>Liturgy</u>, <u>Celebration</u>, <u>Liturgical Ministry</u> and <u>Today's Liturgy</u>. He has also been a contributor to two books, <u>That They Might Have Life</u>, and <u>The Dictionary of Catholic Spirituality</u>. He has served as a teacher, composer, and liturgist in various pastoral and academic settings.

Bob has been composing liturgical music for over 30 years and we use many of his works in our Sunday liturgies including, <u>As the Deer Longs</u>, <u>Shelter Me, O God</u>, <u>Create in Me</u>, <u>Envia Tu Espiritu</u>, <u>Gather</u> <u>Your People</u>, and <u>Flow River Flow</u>. His liturgical music is published by OCP (Oregon Catholic Press) and is featured in numerous hymnals in the United States, Canada, Great Britain and Australia. In 2010 Bob was awarded NPM's (National Association of Pastoral Musicians). Pastoral Musician of the year.

He is currently an adjunct professor at the Graduate Pastoral Ministries Program at Santa Clara University and St. Patrick Seminary, Menlo Park, California with courses focused on systematic theology, fundamental theology, philosophy, Christology, liturgy and ritual music. Bob lives in San Jose, California with his wife, Pia, who has collaborated with him on much of his bilingual music.

Bob Hurd often conducts workshops throughout the country. He uses his music to bring the scriptures and God's word alive in song. Our Music Director, Joe DeSanctis, has performed with Bob Hurd when he brought one of his workshops to the Bronx a few years ago!

Liturgy Notes for the Second Sunday of Lent February 28, 2021

"He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all will give us everything else along with him." Abraham responded in faith to God's command to slaughter his son Isaac. Why? Abraham knew that everything, even life itself, belonged wholly to the wise and loving God who had called him, and who could even raise the dead (Heb 11:19). In the Transfiguration God reveals to Peter, James, and John the glory that is given to us when we give everything to God. "Precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his faithful," because then the Lord raises us to a new and everlasting life with him. (us.magnificat.net)
