"HE COMES IN THREE"

In our everyday culture the number 3 has varied meanings—sometimes good; sometimes bad. For example, here's a good thing: "The Third Time's The Charm. This is pretty universally understood as meaning hope or confidence for the future. You may have failed 2 times at something, but if you try the 3rd time, it might well-happen. Conversely: "Three On A Match" means bad luck. Sources say that the phrase began in the trenches in World War I. If one soldier in a foxhole lit his cigarette on a match, it would allow a sniper to spot him; if a second on the same match took the light, the sniper would take aim, and the third soldier lighting his cigarette from that match was a goner. This also could be applied to sailors underway at night during World War II. If three "swabbies" lit up on the one match, it would be long enough for the Captain of a U-Boat to take aim and fire a torpedo. Bye, Bye ship!
