This Sunday's Gospel account from the Gospel of St. Luke really gives us an insight into the devil or Satan as he is also known.

And Luke tells us that Satan is not finished---he will return to try Jesus and tempt Him again. Doesn't seem like Satan is hesitating to go after the Son of God Himself. Pretty cheeky, right?

So if Satan goes so far as to harass Jesus, don't you think that he might attack you at whatever point of weakness you have? Use this wonderful period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving that we call Lent, to strengthen yourself against the attacks of the devil.
